Dear Ouachitonians,

Seldom does a guest spend more than a few hours on the Ouachita campus without commenting, "You have the finest group of students we have ever seen!" The comment comes so often, so completely unsolicited, and so enthusiastically that there must be some basis for it, particularly since those thus impressed are frequently men and women constantly on other campuses.

Former students of Ouachita--even those who were able to stay only a term or two--are loud in their praise of this school. Upon even the slightest provocation they will discuss at great length the virtues of the "Queen of the College World," at times making themselves almost as obnoxious to non-Ouachitonians as a Texan does himself to non-Texans.

While I sincerely hope that you will always sing the praises of your school, I hope even more fervently that in the days ahead you will live by the principles which have produced the spirit. The ultimate test of an institution's effectiveness is what her students do after they leave the campus, and if I could have one wish it would be that each of you would live your Christian idealism day by day so that those who come in contact with you will know that you, like your college, have something so distinctively different that the most glowing superlatives will not begin to do justice to it.

May God bless each and every one of you to this end.

In the years to come, if this book will bring back the memories of this year at Ouachita and will cause you to love Ouachita even more, then all of our work will not have been in vain.


In all sincerity, it has been a pleasure to serve you as Co-Editors of the 1957 Ouachitonian. We hope you like it.
