Ouachita Baptist University gathers regularly as a community to mark significant moments in campus life, such as Fall Convocation and Spring Commencement. It is appropriate in these instances for the University to raise a unified voice to celebrate its commitments to faith and learning.

In 2008, President Rex M. Horne, Jr. initiated a process that led to the commissioning of a University hymn. After consultation among several members of the faculty and administration, an ad hoc committee comprised of Rob Hewell, Ian Cosh, and Deborah Root was appointed to oversee the project.

See God's Light features one stanza each focusing on the three words that appear in the University seal: vision (stanza one), service (stanza two), and integrity (stanza three). Stanza four is a summary proclamation of praise to God.

The text was written by Terry W. York, a hymnist, poet, author, and professor at Truett Seminary in Waco, Texas. The tune OUACHITA was written specifically for this text by C. David Bolin, a composer and minister of music at the First Baptist Church of Waco.

See God's Light was performed for the first time at the Spring Commencement ceremony on May 9, 2009.

OUACHITA AT A GLANCE

Ouachita has served for 131 years as a private Christian liberal arts university. Founded in Arkadelphia, Ark., in 1886, Ouachita is affiliated with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention. Our current enrollment of 1,517 students includes 64% of students from Arkansas, 23% from Texas, 10% from other states and 3% from more than 30 nations.

At Ouachita Baptist University, we aspire to be:

- unashamedly Christian and unapologetically academic;
- · relationally invested in the whole person development of our students; and
- intentionally focused on fostering a highly residential campus community that prepares our
 graduates to impact their world in their generation for the Kingdom of God and the common good.

Academic Difference

Profile: The average ACT score for our 2016 freshman cohort was 24.3 compared to a national ACT average of 20.8 and a state average of 20.2. Ouachita currently has 84 Governor's Distinguished Scholars and 14 National Merit Finalists enrolled.

Graduation: Our most recent graduation rate is 70.44%, the second highest graduation rate among all colleges and universities in Arkansas.

Placement: Among our most recent graduates, 93% were employed or accepted to graduate school within six months of graduation.

Programs: Ouachita focuses on academic excellence in seven schools: Business, Christian Studies, Education, Fine Arts, Humanities, Natural Sciences and Social Sciences.

- Top majors based on enrollment are business, Christian studies, biology, communications, elementary education, music and psychology.
- New fields of study include majors in biophysics, community & family services and public history as well as an emphasis in entrepreneurship.
- · Ouachita offers an accelerated three-year Biomedical Scholars Program.

Personal Difference

Faculty: Ouachita has 111 full-time faculty members with 86% holding terminal degrees and a student-tofaculty ratio of 13:1 which allows our students to get to know their professors on a personal level as mentors and role models.

Staff: There are 200 full-time staff members, which is a 2:1 ratio of staff to faculty, well below the national average of 3:1 among private institutions; Ouachita is lean and effective in its operation.

Service: During the past academic year, Ouachita students, faculty and staff logged 49,000 hours in volunteer service projects locally, nationally and globally. For our approximately 1,500 students and 300 faculty and staff, the total equals 27 hours per person.

Spirit: Ouachita has been named the top college in the nation in school spirit, according to *Forbes*' 2016 #MyTopCollege social media competition.

Athletics: While Ouachita has the smallest enrollment among the Great American Conference's 12 member schools, the Tigers are strongly competitive. Ouachita fields 14 intercollegiste teams (7 for women and 7 for men) in NCAA Division II.

OUACHITA COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

Commencement is an important ceremony in the lives of Ouachita graduates and faculty because it symbolizes the completion of a primary mission of the University, the awarding of academic degrees. Because of the significance of the occasion, it is requested that appropriate respect for the dignity of the ceremony be maintained by all in attendance.

Academic Regalia

The academic regalia worn by faculty and students during Commencement exercises originated in the Middle Ages when a warm gown and hood were essential in unheated buildings. The colors displayed on the academic costume signify different degrees, academic disciplines, and school colors. The border of the hood indicates the academic discipline in which one's highest degree has been earned; the lining indicates the degree-granting institution by its color. Faculty holding doctoral degrees have velvet stripes down the front of the gown, and in most cases, three velvet stripes on each sleeve. Examples of traditional academic colors follow.

Presidential Regalia

The President of the University wears two special emblems during Commencement ceremonies and other special events. The Presidential Medallion, donated by the faculty in 1970 for the inauguration of Ouachita's 12th President, Dr. Daniel R. Grant, is crafted in gold with images of an open Bible and a flaming torch, symbolic of the purposes of the University. The Chain of Office was donated by the Administrative Council for the inauguration of Dr. Andrew Westmoreland in 1998. The chain features gold banners that bear the names and terms of office of all 16 Ouachita presidents.

Ceremonial Mace

A ceremonial mace is used during all Ouachita Commencements. The mace, styled after the weapon of the Middle Ages, is a symbol of the authority vested in the University, its officers, and faculty. The Ouachita mace was prepared from wood saved from Old Main, which served as the University's primary classroom and office building from its construction in 1889 until it was destroyed by fire in 1949. The mace is carried by the Commencement Marshal who leads the procession of graduates. This year, the mace will be carried by Dr. Michael E. Reynolds, Professor of Kinesiology and Leisure Studies.

Inaugural Baccalaureate Address

The baccalaureate address at the first graduation exercises for Ouachita Baptist College on June 13, 1888, was delivered by the founding president, Dr. John W. Conger. In recognition of the university's ongoing commitment to its mission, a copy of Dr. Conger's address is included in the Commencement processional. It is carried by a senior member of the Ouachita faculty, who serves as a Commencement Marshal. This year, that faculty member is Dr. Samuel Ray Granade, Director of Library Services and Professor of History.

Recognizing Graduates

As the President of the University confers the appropriate degrees, the mortar board tassel is moved to the left side, a symbol of having attained the status of graduated scholar. Family and friends of each graduate are encouraged to stand as the diploma is presented individually by the President.

Honor Graduates

Honor graduates are recognized during the presentation of diplomas according to the following categories.

cum laude (with honors): 3.500 grade point average *magna cum laude* (with high honors): 3.750 grade point average *summa cum laude* (with highest honors): 3.950 grade point average

Summa cum laude graduates wear distinctive gold medallions indicating the attainment of highest academic honors. Magna cum laude graduates wear gold braids. Cum laude graduates wear purple braids.

The gold stole worn by some graduates signifies successful completion of the Carl Goodson Honors Program.

Blue and green braids are worn by members of Alpha Chi, a national honor society that recognizes academic excellence and exemplary character among college and university students.

University Seal

Ouachita proudly displays a university seal to illustrate its role in higher education and its commitment to the work of the Kingdom of God. The circular shape of the seal is traditional but also serves as a reminder of athletics traditions, *The Ouachita Circle* alumni magazine, and the family spirit of the Ouachita community. The outer circle highlights Ouachita's founding and service for the past 131 years. The inner circle states the fundamental values of the university: vision, integrity, and service. The shield contains elements that, like a family coat-of-arms, define the Ouachita experience: the bar across the center (or fess) symbolizes an emphasis on service; the torch stands for the pursuit of truth in learning; and the cross represents the Christian foundation that sustains the institution.
