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### MINUTES.

LEAD HILL, ARK., September 19, 1884.

delegates representing the churches comprising the White Haptist Association met with the church at Lead Hill, how County Arkansas, on Friday before the third Sabbath in Moptember, 1884, according to adjournment, when, as by movious appointment, the introductory sermon was preached by hider C. H. Mayfield, text: John 17th chapter and latter clause the 4th verse, "I have finished the work thou gavest me to The important truths presented during the discousre were moved with marked attention by the delegates and the congregation present.

Prayer by Elder W. D. Jennings, after which the Moderator, lilder H. H. Hilton, called the Association to order.

The former clerk being absent, Bro. W. A. Collis was appointed clerk, pro. tem.

Letters from the different churches were called for and read, and the names of the delegates enrolled.

On motion the Association held the annual election by acclamation for Moderator and Clerk for the ensuing Associational year, which resulted in the election of Elder H. H. Hilton, Moderator: and Wm. A. Collis, Clerk.

Called for letters petitioning membership, when Bro. I. B. Lovell came forward and presented a letter from the church at l'airview, asking for membership in this Association, and sending as their delegates Brethren I. B. Lovell and T. J. Lockhart.

The church was received and the right hand of fellowship extended to the delegates by the Moderator.

Then J. H. McEntire presented a letter from Shady Grove

Church, Searcy County, Ark. This church was received and right hand of fellowship extended to her delegate by the Moderator. Also a letter was sent up from Oak Grove Church, Baxter County, Ark., and was received by the Association.

On motion the Association adjourned till 3 o'clock, P. M., with prayer by the Moderator.

3 o'clock, p. m. Association met according to adjournment. The Moderator presiding. Prayer by Eld. H. Sasser.

Called and corrected roll of delegates and marked absentees. Read Constitution and Rules of Decorum.

Called for corresponding letters and messengers from sister Associations, when Elders J. W. Hurd, I Davis and W. H. Raly presented a minute of Crooked Creek Association and were received as corresponding messengers from that body.

Elders N. Barnett, W. F. Cantrell and Brother James Baker presented a minute from Union Association, (Mo.) and were received as corresponding messengers from that body.

Elder A. R. Steveson presented a minute of Blue Mountain Association and was received as corresponding messenger from that body.

Elder W. D. Jennings presented a minute from Big Creek Association which was received.

Visiting ministers of the same faith and order were invited to seats with us. Eld. H. Sasser accepted the invitation and took his seat to participate in our deliberations.

Mr. Horn's report is as follows: Attended one

church regular once a month; another one five months; baptized six; amount received for services, \$5.00.

Elder L. A. Barker's report is as follows: Preached thirty sermons; baptized six; assisted in the ordination of one minister and deacon; amount received for labor, 14.25.

Elder C. H. Mayfield's report is as follows: Preached sixty-five sermons; prayed 81 public prayers; baptized twelve; traveled seven hundred and seventy-nine miles; assisted in the ordination of one minister and one deacon; sold 7575 pages of Baptist literature; amount received from chirches, \$4.45; amount received from friend on Orcut Flat, \$5.40; ferage expense, 3.25.

Elder H. Sasser's report is as follows: Preached to two churches until July; baptized 17; received in produce and money, \$60.00.

Eld. W. D. Jennings reports: Preached 98 sermons; baptized 24; traveled 456 miles; assisted in the ordination of one minister and one deacon; amount received for labor, \$16.40.

Called for the reports of the different committees, when the Committee on Baptist literature begged further time to make their report, which was granted them.

We your Committee on Haptist literature, beg leave to submit the following report: First, we, for reason of the very highest importance, would recommend the careful reading of the Bible. Second, the Evangel,, because it is our own State paper, and the only religious periodical of Baptist faith in the State, and because it is an able and sound paper. Third, out side of our State we can heartily endorse the American Boptist Flag published by D. B. Ray, St. Louis, Mo. Fouth the Ford's Christian Repository by Fund, St. Louis, Mo. Fifth, the Bap-J. R. Graves, Memphis, Tena.

Elder W. Denton reported as follows:

I have preached to three churches a part of my time; my home church, Mt. Pleasant, Palestine and George's Creek. For about three months I have aided in the Sunday school at Mt. Pleasant, also a prayer meeting at same. I have visited Magness Church, held a meeting of days in connection with her loved Pastor, W. M. Horn; also meeting of days at New Liberty. As to the fruits of my labors the statistics of the above named churches will show.

Illed for report of a standing Committee that was appointed by the Moderator, at the last Association, to visit New Prospect, Moderator, and Macedonia churches. Elders J. B. Davis and H. Mandr and they did not visit New Prospect. It was moved that and brothren be granted another year to comply with the remote Elder H. H. Hilton stated that Elder W. D. White did with Rehoboth Church, and found it in a good condition, and proached to the church during the year; also Elder H. H. Hillon stated that Elder A. J. Copeland had visited Macedonia Church, and preached to it.

On motion it was resolved that we adopt the Missionary plan, at laid down in the minutes of the Association held in 1880.

Eubank, Treasurer; and appointed the first meeting to be held at Gassville, Baxter County, Ark., Saturday before the third Sabbath in December, 1884.

On motion it was resolved that the corresponding delegates write their own letters.

Resolved, that we hold our next Association with Pleasant Hill Church, Marion County, Ark.

Report of Elder H. Sasser, Traveling Missionary for the White River Baptist Association in the year 1884, is as follows:

Sermons and exortations delivered twenty, baptised eight, traveled two hundred miles, organized one church, preached to one destitute church. They both adopted our articles of faith, and become members of this Association. Total membership of both churches, twenty-eight. Received of Central Board, twenty dollars.

On motion it was resolved that this Association tender their thanks to the citizens of Lead Hill and vicinity, for their kindness and hospitality shown to this Association, and it is the prayers of this body, that these people may continue to prosper, both spirually and temporally.

Elder L. A. Barker was elected to preach the introductory sermon at our next meeting of the Association, and Elder W. M. Horn as his alternate; also Elder Wm. Denton, was elected to preach the Missionary sermon, on Sabbath at 11 o'clock, A. M., and Elder H. H. Hilton his alternate.

On motion it was resolved that we have our minutes printed by a Baptist Publishing Company.

Resolved, that the clerk be allowed \$10 for his services and superintending the printing and distribution of the minutes of this Association.

Committee on divine service reported that Elder I. Davis preaches at the Hall at early candle light, followed by Elder H. H. Hilton.

Adjourned with prayer, by the Moderator, until Monday morning, 8 o'clock, A. M.

On Sabbath at 10 A. M. Elder H. H. Hilton, preached in the Grove near town, Text 2nd Chapter of the Acts and 37th verse; also at 11 A. M. Elder N. Barnett preached an interesting sermon, Text 3rd Chapter and 21st verse of Romans. After services a public collection was taken up, amounting to \$13.55, to be used by the Association as it sees proper.

Sunday evening 3 o'clock, P. M., Elder A. R. Steveson promoted an interesting sermon to a large audience in the grove near town; also at early candle light, Elder W. F. Cantrel prototed, followed by Elder H. Sasser.

Monday morning 8 o'clock A. M. The Association met purment to adjournment, the Moderator in the chair. After prayor by Elder A. R. Steveson, the Association called to order and the regular order of business taken up. By request of Happt church it was resolved that we strike the name Egypt from our minutes and insert Pine Grove instead.

()n motion it was resolved that we drop the name Macedonia, from our minutes.

On motion it was resolved that we have as many copies of the minutes of this Association printed as the money will permit.

Moved that this Association supply Lead Hill church with a preacher for the next ensuing year, By a unanimous vote it was agreed that Elder Wm. Denton preach to Lead Hill Church. On motion it was resolved that each Pastor of their respective churches preach at least one Missionary sermon to their churches, and take up a public collection after the same. Moved that this Association advise each church in its bounds, who have no house of their own to worship in, to build one of their own, independent of school house. On motion it was resolved that we hold four minister's and deacon's meetings during the next Associational year. On motion it was resolved that we hold the first minister's and deacon's meeting with the Hopewell church, commancing on Saturday before the first Lord's day, in December, 1884. On motion it was resolved that we hold our second min-Inter's and deacon's meeting with New Liberty Church. On motion it was resolved that we hold our third minister's and deacon's meeting with New Harmony church. On motion it was resolved that we hold our fourth minister's and deacons meeting with New Hope church. Moved that Elder J. B. Davis preach the introductory sermon, at the minister's and deacons meeting at Hopewell. Bro. R. D. Casey was appointed to represent us in the state convention. Moved that we adjourn to meet with the Baptist church at Pleasant Hill, on Friday at 11 b'clock, A. M., before the third Salbath in September, A. D ELDER H. H. HILTON, Moderator. 1885.
