Report of committee on Education read and adopted, and is as follows: White River Association, by her action years ago, in establishing Mountain Home college took high grounds on the subject of christian education. No new utterance is needed to show where the Association stands on the subject. They have in the most positive manner declared their conviction that Christian Education is

an essential part of the work committed to the church of Christ for spreading the gospel and advancing the cause of the Redeemer. Having distinguished itself among the Baptist organization of Arkansas by undertaking a work of such magnitude, it is of the highest importance that the Association take no backward step, but that it give the Institution that hearty support that is becoming to this body. A sufficient subscription was raised to pay off the \$6000 debt, and has been paid in except about \$1200 We urge upon those indebted to the College by subscription, note, or otherwise to forward the amount to Cap. Brethren, hall it be said of us that our claim to be Missionaries is an empty claim, or shall we prove our faith by our works?
