

# Proceedings.

BOONEVILLE, LOGAN COUNTY, ARK., Sept. 18, 1897.

Dardanelle Baptist Association met with Lick Creek church in its forty-third annual session at 10 a.m. The moderator and clerk being absent, a temporary organization was affected by electing Eld. E. H. Stafford, moderator pro. tem., and I. A. Iluckaby, clerk pro. tem. The moderator led the body in depotional exercises.

Intermission of fifteen minutes.

Eld. E. H. Stafford preached the introductory sermon from John 14:6: "I am the way," followed by Eld. J. F. Brice. I wayer by Eld. J. B. Ingle. Adjourned to 1:30 p. m.

### . AFTERNOON SESSION.

Re-assembled at 1:30. Devotional exercises led by the moderator.

Read the letters and enrolled the names of the messengers. On motion, nominations for permanent officers were declared in order. Elds M. P. Blair, E. H. Stafford and J. W. Richardson were nominated for moderator and I. A. Huckaby for clerk and treasurer. A ballot was taken, and while the tellers were counting, the moderator appointed Eld. J. W. Third, That we believe that this lukewarmness and non-action on the part our churches in the mission work is in part due to the financial depression prevailing over our land, and in part to the want of knowledge among members of churches, of the different departments and the great good acaphished thereby.

tion work in all its departments, giving them a knowledge of the fields now

appled by Baptists as missionaries and the success of their work.

Second, That we be careful to encourage by kind words, prayer, and our means, any young man of promising gifts for the ministry to secure as good an education as possible.

Third, That we heartily recommend Ouachita, Central and Mountain Home Baptist colleges as the nearest and best schools to send our children to

for higher education.

Fourth, That we do not recommend any of our young ministers to attend the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary until the present president, Prof. Whitsitt, be removed or make a more satisfactory recantation of his views that contradict Baptist faith and history.

Fifth, That we do earnestly commend to the brotherhood of this association, the Arkansas Baptist as a religious journal worthy of your support.

We, your Committee on Sunday-schools, beg leave to report:

We find from the reading of the different letters from the churches composing the Dardanelle Association, there is a great lack of Sunday-schools. It seems that pastors and churches are careless or neglectful of one of the most important factors or helps to our churches. Let us, as ministers and messengers of this association, resolve that we will go to work and organize a Sunday-school in each of our respective churches, and not rest satisfied until we have a good, live Sunday-school organized. If we fail to do this, other denominations will get our children and often teach them error which is hard to erast from their minds. The consequence is that our families are divided and confirmed infidels among them. Let us do all we can to teach them in our own principles. Let us not be satisfied with less than a well organized school in every church. We further recommend that there be a Baptist Sunday-school Convention organized within the bounds of this association.

Resolved, That on all questions arising in this body no member shall speak but once, then not to exceed five minutes, unless by consent of the moderator.

The Committee on Temperance submitted the following report:

We are glad that the cause of temperance is gaining ground within the bounds of Dardanelle Association, and we recommend that the following resolutions be strictly adhered to:

Resolved, 1. That we will give our influence in our private circles and in our churches against the use of alcoholic beverages.

2. We believe that it is the duty of all Christians to heartly co-operate with the civil authorities in enacting laws to prevent the sale and use of all intoxicating drinks.

3. That we hold the Bible to be a book that teaches that God's children should not indulge in the use or sale of intoxicating drinks, nor should they

alan petitions for the sale of the same.

4. That it is the duty of all ministers of Christ not only to abstain from the use of alcholic beverages, but to lift up their voices against it in the pulpit and alsowhere, and that we urge our churches, through Dardanelle Association, to continue in membership no person who publicly advocates the license of drinking saloons, or invests money in the saloon business, or who suffers his property to be used for it in any way.

5. That this association will not seat any church in this body that is knowingly guilty of retaining a pastor who gives his influence or votes for the sale

of intoxicating liquors.
