We believe it is the duty of Baptists to provide and means of education for their young people. It al part of the great commission our charter of miniation and labor is the commission to teach. The placed teachers in the church when he organized better the teachers in the church when he organized better the teachers and conditions of our have made it necessary that we obey this command at once. The forces of unrighteousness are well

trained and equipped for the warfare. We can not hope to hold our own among the powers that work for regenerating the world without a full and complete educational work. To meet this demand the Baptist fathers in Arkansas have put in operation a splendid system of affiliated schools for all grades and courses. In this system there are two colleges and four academies, with property valued at \$250,000. Last year there were 1300 students in attendance, with eighty teachers. Ouachita college, the largest and oldest of the institutions, is situated at Arkadelphia within easy reach of Caddo River Associatiod. Here our young people can find the very best educational advantages to be had in the State, at the lowest possible cost. We recommend that our people write to Prof. J. W. Conger for information, and especially do we recommend that every young minister who wishes to prepare himself for efficient service to consider carefully the advantages to be had at Ouachita college, and if he will enter there and avail himself of the training needful, we pledge prayerful, sympathetic and financial support of this Association. After being ably, forcibly and interestingly discussed by Prof. J. W. Conger, H. L. Winburne and W. H. Anderson the report was adopted.
