PROCEEDINGS.

The 50th Annual Session of the Dardanelle Baptist Association convened with Cane Creek Church, Prairie View, Logan County, Arkansas, at 10 o'clock a. m., September 17th, 1904, and engaged in devotional exercises, led by the moderator.

At 11 a. m. Elder R. R. Elmore preached the introductory sermon, Judges 7. 31. After intermission for dinner the body was called to order by the moderator, and Bro. W. U. Balkman led in prayer.

The clerk Bro. J. I. Cowger, being absent, Bro. W. U. Balkman was chosen clerk pro tem.

Letters from the churches were read. The election of permanent officers resulted in the choice of Elder M. P. Blair, moderator, and J. A. Taylor, clerk and treasurer.

Petitionary letters were called for and Ward church was received and the hand of fellowship extended her messengers.

Corresponding messengers and visiting brethren were then enrolled as follows: Elder G. T. Woodard, Russellville; W. W. Rivers, Green Briar; Elder James Sykes, Concord; W. W. Gardner, Orphan Home, Arkadelphia.

The moderator appointed Elder J. S. Gray, J. B. Smith, W. R. Blair and W. K. Surguine, committee on divine service.

Adjourned to meet at 7-30 p. m., at which time Elder J. J. Hurt preached, Romans 1. 16.

Called to order by the moderator; prayer by Elder W. R. Blair. After reading James 1. Elder W. W. Gardner addressed the association in behalf of the Orphans Home, and \$11.13 was contributed for that institution. Recess until 7-30 p. m.

Convened at 7-30 p. m.; prayer by Elder T. D. Frazier, after which Elder L. A. Robertson preached from Isa. 52, 1. Adjourned to meet at 8 a. m.

Monday, Sept. 19: Met pursuant to adjournment. Elder J. R. G. W. N. Adams read the 135th Ps. and led in prayer.

REPORT OF COMMITTEES.

Elder L. A. Robertson, from the committee on temperance, read the following report :

We, your committee on temperance, submit the following report :

We are very thankful that both Yell and Logan counties, the territory of this Association have voted out license saloons, and we feel sure temperance is gaining ground; but we recognize that eternal vigilance is the only way we can hold our ground. Therefore we recommend that pastors teach their churches the evils of saloons, the drink habit and all other forms of intemperance. And we further recommend that our people help to enforce the law against "blind tigers," and that our churches be urged to discipline those within their jurisdiction who use intoxicating drinks of any kind as a beverage.

That the work of preaching the gospel in all parts of the state is an enterprise in which the Baptists of Arkansas have engaged for many years—in fact since our denomination had its beginning in the state, though with vary-

ing degrees of interest and effort; but during the few years just past, the work has been greatly enlarged. It now receives far more liberal support and is followed by greater results than at any former time in our history, which facts show that the enterprise is not only prosperous but also permanent. The facts relative to the work are so well known, or can be so conveniently learned, that we deem a recital of them in detail unnecessary. We would remind our people that while the work is now more prosperous than formerly, the needs and opportunities for state mission work are as great, and even greater than in the past. Arkansas as a whole is a needy mission field, and we believe that it especially needs the gospel as preached by Baptists. Therefore we urge without reference to plans or methods that our people give liberally and with a "religious regularity" to state missions. (Adopted.)

Since our last report we have made progress on all lines. There are 162 children in the home; two have passed over the river into the bright beyond. Two have married, and one to a good home. While we have good buildings they are not sufficient for those we have and for the large number in our State that are left without father or mother. We are planning for a large addition to our building, giving us twelve more rooms. But the addition cannot be made without money; so your committee would urge the pastors to take collections in their churches as soon as possible and send it to W. W. Gardner, Arkadelphia, Ark. May God bless the noble institution. (Adopted.)

The first meeting of the board was held at Dardanelle in October and Elder M. P. Blair chosen chairman, and J. I. Cowger secretary and treasurer.

Appropriations were made as follows: Ranger church \$25, Zion church \$20, Baker Creek church \$25, Delaware church \$25, Zion Hill church \$25, Danville church \$25, Havana church \$25, —Total \$170.00.

Also at the March meeting we agreed to supplement the salary of Elder Caloway at Belleville the amount of \$6.25 per month on condition the church raise the sum of \$35.00. We also invited the ministers in the association to do as much as eight or ten days mission work gratuitously.
