### PROCEEDINGS.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMAER 26, 1896.

THE GAINESVILLE MISSONARY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION movened with Rock Hill Church, pursuant to adjournment, at 11 o'clock A. M. The introductory sermon was preached by by Elder G. Lively. His text, 1st Peter: 1st chapter, part of 11th verse.

The body was then called to order by the former Moderator.

A motion was then carried to adjourn until 2 P. M., for refreshments, which was furnished in abundance on the ground.

### AFTERNOON SESSION.

At 2 o'clock the Association was called together, and business resumed.

Then on motion, the body went into election by ballot for permanent officers of the Assocciation, which resulted in the election of Elder G. Lively, for Moderator; Henry Holcomb for Clerk and T. L. B. Thorn for Treasurer.

The Moderator, on taking the chair, thanked the body for the honor conferred, and then invited the body to join in prayer, led by Eld. E. D. Cooper.

Petitionary letters were then called for and five responded, one from Bark Camp Island, one from Jerico, one from Oak Grove and one from St. Francis churches, by letter and delegation; and on motion, received and messengers invited to seats with the body.
