PIKE COUNTY, ARK., SEPT. 13th, A. D. 1890.

The Caddo River Regular Baptist Association met at Bethel Church, at the usual time, viz: 11 o'clock A. M., on Saturday before the Second Lord's day in September. The above named church was agreed upon by a called Council of the Association as the place of holding this Session.

The Council met at Bethel Church on Friday, before the First Lord's day in July, A. D. 1890.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by Eld. E. Wright, followed by Eld. J. J. Hughes, from the 26th and 27th verses of the 3rd Chapter of Gallatians. Closing prayer by Eld. L. Avery. The body then adjourned until 3 o'clock, p. m.

Pursuant to adjournment, the body came together by singing. The moderator read the First Chapter of First John, and the good old hymn, "On Jordan's Stormy Banks I Stand." The hymn was sung with feeling and prayer offered by the moderator.

The Association was then declared ready for business.

3rd. Election of officers. Elders J. E. Kennedy and H. G. York, of Red River Association, were appointed to hold the ballot. The election resulted in the choice of Eld. J. J. Hughes for Moderator, Eld. E. Wright for clerk and Deacon G. B. Willis for Treasurer.

4th. Inviting visiting members to seats.

5th. Called for correspondence. Elders J. E. Kennedy and I. F. Welch, responded from Red River Association.

6th. Appointed committees as follows:

A. R. Chitwood, J. R. Motley, with the messengers of Bethel Church, were appointed the committee on preaching.

The day being far spent the body enacted that the Moderator have the privilege of making out a list of the other committees to night which was accomplished at the residence of Elder T. J. Welch, by the assistance of our host and clerk, viz:

- 1st. On Documents, G. L. Tanner, G. W. Pettitt and J. M. Smith.
- 2nd. On Destitution, Eld. W. W. Carson, G. B. Willis and M. A. Robins.
- 3rd. On the State of Religion, Eld. T. J. Welch, G. W. Johnson and T. J. Cunningham.
- 4th. On Temperance, W. P. Taylor, H. C. Laekey and P. Wasson.
- 5th. The Duties of Pastors to Churches, J. B. Payne, W. Ward and N. L. Huggins.
- 6th. The Duties of Churches to Pastors, Eld. D. Bright, L. Harvey and W. H. Reeves.
- 7th. On Finance, W. D. Dunson, J. T. Miller and R. W. Carpenter.
- 8th. On Obituaries, A. M. Neal, E. Burns and J. C. Thomas.

The Preaching Committee made a report for preaching to night and to-morrow. We sang a doxology and adjourned until Monday 8 a. m.

MONDAY MORNING, 8 A. M.

The Moderator read the 30th hymn of the Evergreen selection also the 46th Psalm and after singing he offered prayer. The roll was called and absentees marked. The Minutes was next read, corrected and adopted. Next, this body enacted that the speeches be limited to 5 minutes and that no one be allowed to speak twice until all brethren desiring to speak had spoken. By action of the body we had no preaching at 11 o'clock. Reports of committees were called for and received as follows:

- 1st. On documents. "We your committee on documents beg leave to submit the following report: We find 21 churches represented; 5 petitionary letters and 2 churches petitioning for the next session of this body to be held with them, viz: Black Springs and Mt. Zion, South."

2nd. Duties of Churches to Pastors.

We your committee ask leave to report: "As it is necessary that every church be supplied with a pastor or shepherd to look after the welfare of the flock, the Lord has made overseers to administer unto the churches, spiritual things that they may grow thereby. It is the duty of the church to meet their pastor promptly at their stated meetings and also to see that their temporal wants are supplied. For we are taught in the Word that as they administer unto us spiritual things, we should not withhold our carnal things. Rom. 15th chap. 27th verse; First Cor. 9th chap. 11th verse; Gal. 6th chap. 6th verse. For God has ordained that they who preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel. We advise all churches to look well to this important duty." Respectfully submitted,

4th. We, your committee on Destitution, make the follow-

ing report: "Dear brethren, we are glad to say that, through the efficiency of our missionary board in using the means placed in their hands for the building up of the cause of our blessed Master in the destitute parts, and through the faithful labors of the missionaries employed by said board, God abundantly blessed the means used—that the destitution is not so great as it has been. But dear brethren, let us not cease our energy in the cause of mission work, as there is still a large field for the work in our bounds. We your committee recommend that you strive to keep a missionary in the field, so that all the destitute parts may be made to blossom as the rose, with the blessed truth of the Gospel of the Son of God, for we know the Gospel is the power of God, unto salvation to every one that believeth. We pray God to direct you in this very important work."

7th. On Obituaries. Sister Emaline Ashcraft of Caney Valley Church, died June the 22nd, 1890. She joined the

Baptist Church June the 29th, A. D. 1889. She was 27 years old.

Sister A. J. Wright of Mt. Pisgah Church died February the 24th, A. D. 1890. She was born near Salem, Columbianna County, Ohio, her parents were John and Phoebe Schooley. She belonged to the Baptist Church over 20 years. She often read the Gospel with tears, in her lastdays. She exhorted her son E. Wright to attend to his christian duties. She was 82 years and 4 days old.

Brother Joseph Vaughn of Bethel Church, Pike Co., age 65 years, who lived a consistent member, died October 1st, 1890.

Sister Ann Miller, of Pilgrim's Rest Church died within the past year.

J. C. Reece of Mt. Zion Church, died December 12th, 1889.

Sister Hags of Refuge Church, Montgomery Co., died, supposed to be 70 years of age.

Sister Martha J. Harley was born in Girson County, West Tennessee, January 4th, 1848. She departed this life December 4th, 1889, being 41 years and 11 months old. She made a profession of faith in the Saviour, September 10th, 1870. She became a member of the Missionary Baptist Church, October A. D. 1879.

Sister Ellen Shepherd of New Bethany Church, departed this life in June A. D. 1890, firm in the faith.

SATURDAY, NINE A. M.

The Convention was called to order by the President who read the 50th Psalm, prayer by Eld. T. J. Welch. Next, renewed the call for delegates. Bethel Church responded.

The Minutes of yesterday were read and adopted. A committee was now appointed to arrange the programme for the next session of this body, consisting of W. F. Willis, J. J. Hughes, Jr. and J. M. Smith.

Next, heard the report of the Superintendent of Sunday Schools. The reports were favorable.

Next, W. W. Carson delivered an interesting lecture on the importance of Sunday Schools.

Adjourned until 3 o'clock, p. m. Preaching at 11 o'clock by Eld. W. W. Carson. Text: Romans 5th chap. and 1st verse.

THREE O'CLOCK, P. M.

The Convention was called to order by the President who read the 54th chap. of Isaah; prayer by W. W. Carson.

Next, renewed call for delegates. Pilgrim's Rest Church responded.

Next, selected time and place for holding the next session of this body. Result. Caney Valley, Pike County, on Friday, before the 1st Sunday in August, 1891.

Programme for next Session: Introductory by Eld. J. E. Kennedy; alternate, W. W. Carson, on Friday, 11 o'clock, a. m. At 3 p. m., organization.

Next, an essay by D. S. P. Black, title: "Are Sunday Schools a Help to Parents?" Also an essay by J. F. Wisener, title: "What is the Duty of Parents to Their Children in Sunday Schools?" Respectfully submitted. W. F. Willis.

Next, we had an interesting lecture by our worthy President on "The Duty of Sunday School Teachers," also by Elders J. M. Smith and T. J. Welch, on "The Importance of a Sunday School in every Church." The convention adjourned until 9 o'clock Sunday morning.

Saturday night preaching by Elders J. M. Smith and W. W. Carson. Text, 4th chap. Amos and 12 verse.

SUNDAY, NINE O'CLOCK A. M.

Convention opened by President reading the 53rd chap. of Isaiah: prayer by R. P. Wilkinson. The minutes of Saturday were read and adopted. We had an interesting Sunday School lesson conducted by the President. We next took up a collection, receiving \$2.31 to pay our pro rata share for Minutes.

The following resolution was adopted: "Resolved that each Sunday School in our bounds, adopt the HARVEST BELLS, as their song book. That each school supply themselves with these books. On motion the Convention adjourned to meet at Caney Valley on Friday, at 11 o'clock, a. m., before the 1st Sunday in August, A. D. 1891. Dear brethren, we had a good time and there was a great interest manifested in the cause of Sunday Schools.

Association; Brethren T. J. Howell and W. H. Black, to Red River Association; Eld. N. H. Harley and Bro A. R. Chitwood, to Saline Association.

Elders W. W. Carson and H. L. Wasson were appointed to preach the next Introductory Sermon. The first District meeting will be held at Bethlehem; the Second, at Pleasant Valley. The Association is divided into four Districts, and they meet on Friday, embracing the fifth Lord's day. The first District on the first 5th Sunday. The Second District, on the second, and so on.

Adjourned to meet at Black Springs, on Saturday, 11 o'clock a. m., embracing the Second Sunday in Sept., A. D. 1891.


