Having made my will I am anxious
to see you as soon as possible with the Dr
Sanderson.

Q^r Sir:

At the request of Mrs Dunbar
I send in above by a man who Mr Shipp
to the Salina. (?) You might suppose
from the tenor of the note that Mr D
calculates upon living long enough to
see you, but that is, to all appearance,
impossible. He told me night before
last that he would die in about

two days. He became worse the day
after you left Stacey, has been con-
tinually discharging blood since
and has had the hicough for four
days. His pulse was good until
about 9 o'clock last night, since
which it has been gradually diminishing.
He has been quite chilled a great
part of the night.
