High School Graduates - Projections

- Total Number
 - o The 2008-2009 total number of high school graduates was 3,329,180.
 - o There will be little to no growth including some losses until 2018-2019 with a projected number of graduates of 3,410,210.
- Private High Schools
 - o The peak projection will be 2011-2012 with a total number of graduates of 312,290 students.
 - o A steady decline is projected to continue through 2018-2019 (277,160 graduates).

Projected Enrollment Summary

- Projected number of high school graduates decline until 2018-2019.
- Projected enrollment for private 4-year degree granting institutions shows 6.1% increase from the Fall 2010 to Fall 2015.
- Female to male ratio projected to be around 1.42:1 by Fall 2018.
- Arkansas private universities female to male ratio is close to 1.12:1.0.

Three Major Concerns According to the 2009 CIRP Freshman Survey

- Placing more emphasis on financial issues when choosing a college to attend
- Greater emphasis on getting a job and being financially well-off
- Expecting to volunteer and participate in community service

 - o an "experiential transcript" documenting student achievement outside the classroom, a tool that can assist in job placement at graduation
 - an endowed international studies program that provides two weeks of overseas travel with students being responsible only for meals and incidentals
- Contributed to 24% enrollment increase from 2004 (487) to 2009 (604).
