Early in the second period the Tigers went ahead on two quick TD's; one by Lamar Watkins and one on a Watkins to Fulford pass.

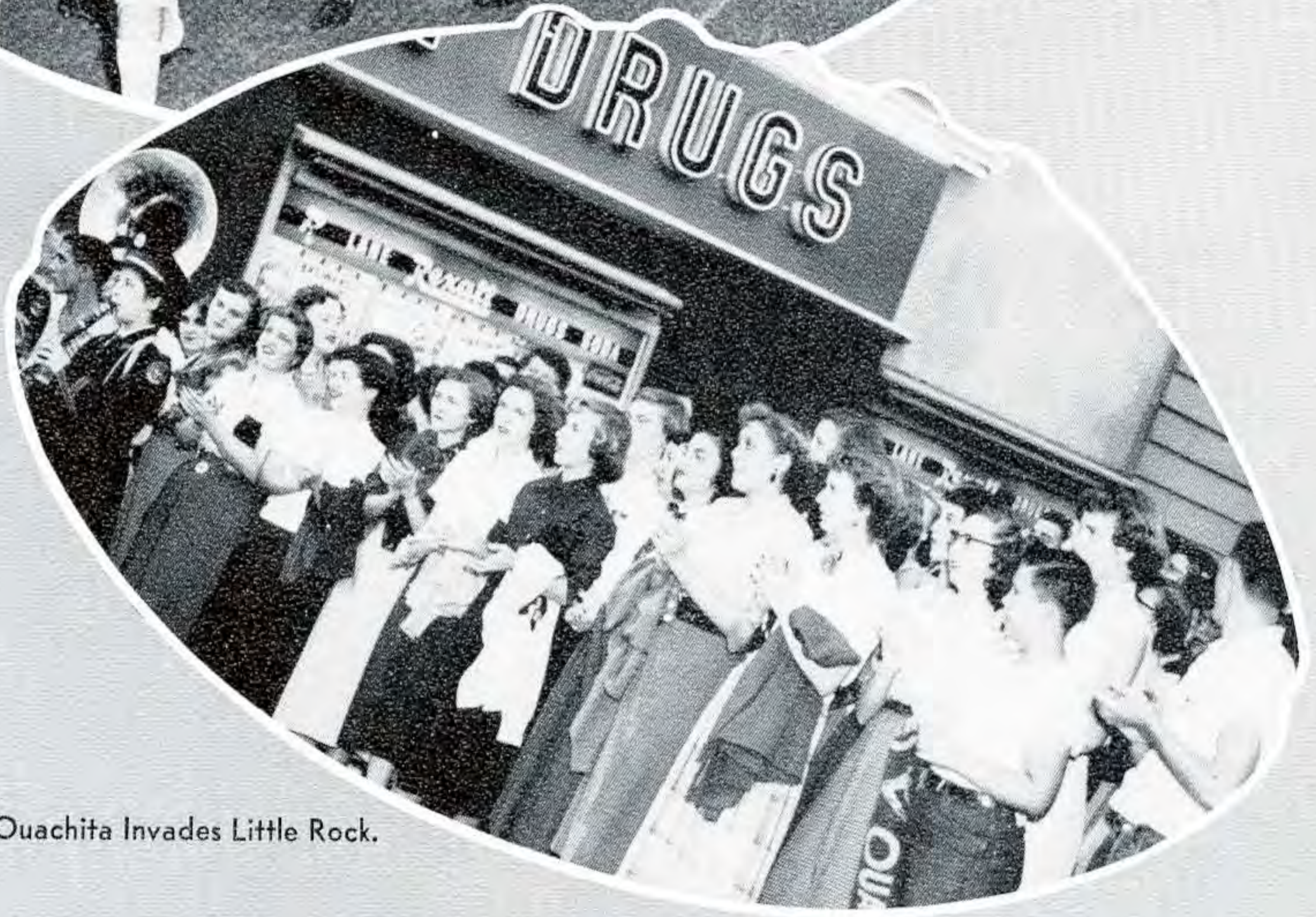
The Choctaws quickly retaliated and at the close of the third quarter led the Tigers 14—13.

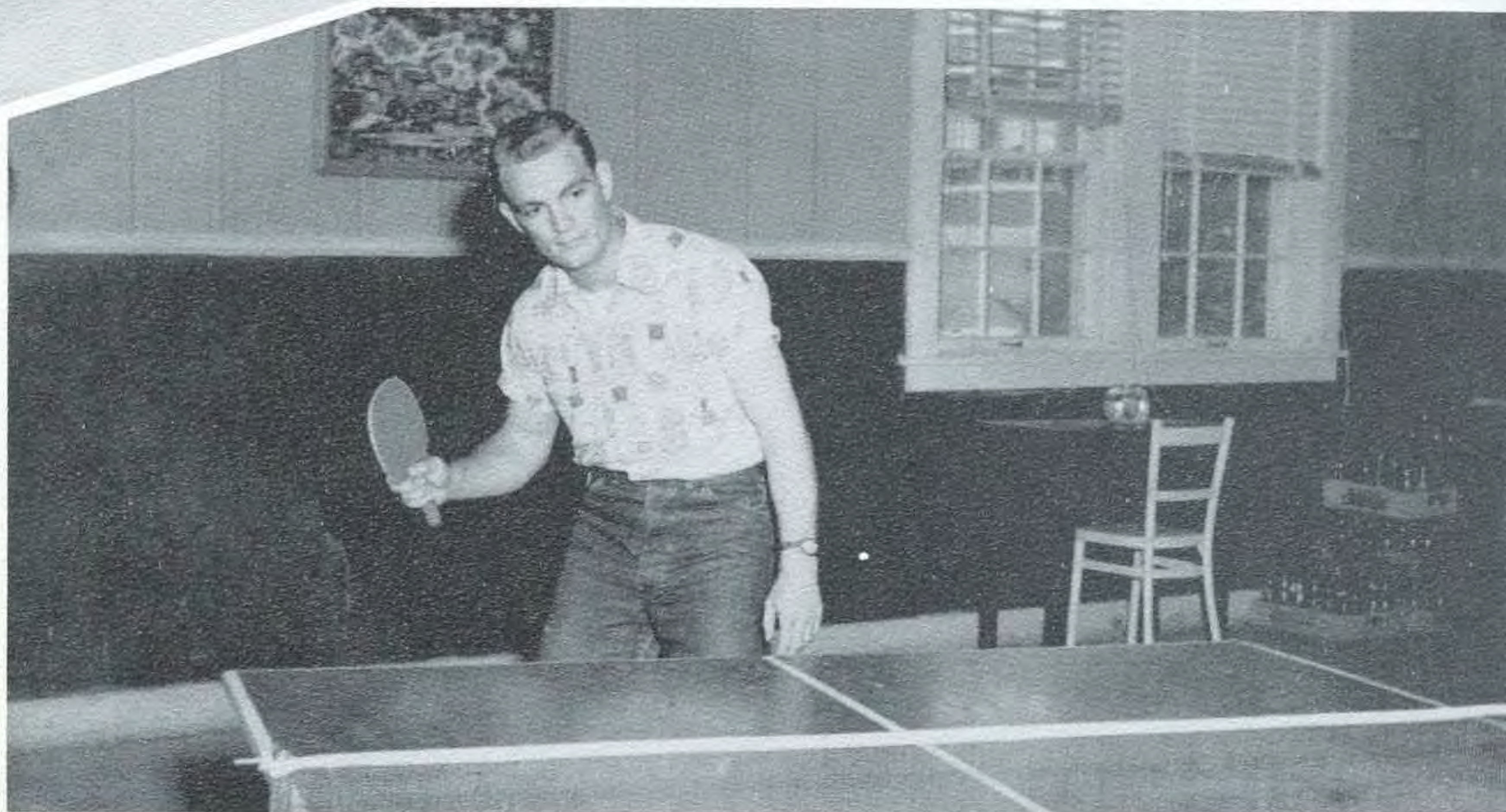
