O—u—a—c—h—i—t—a*

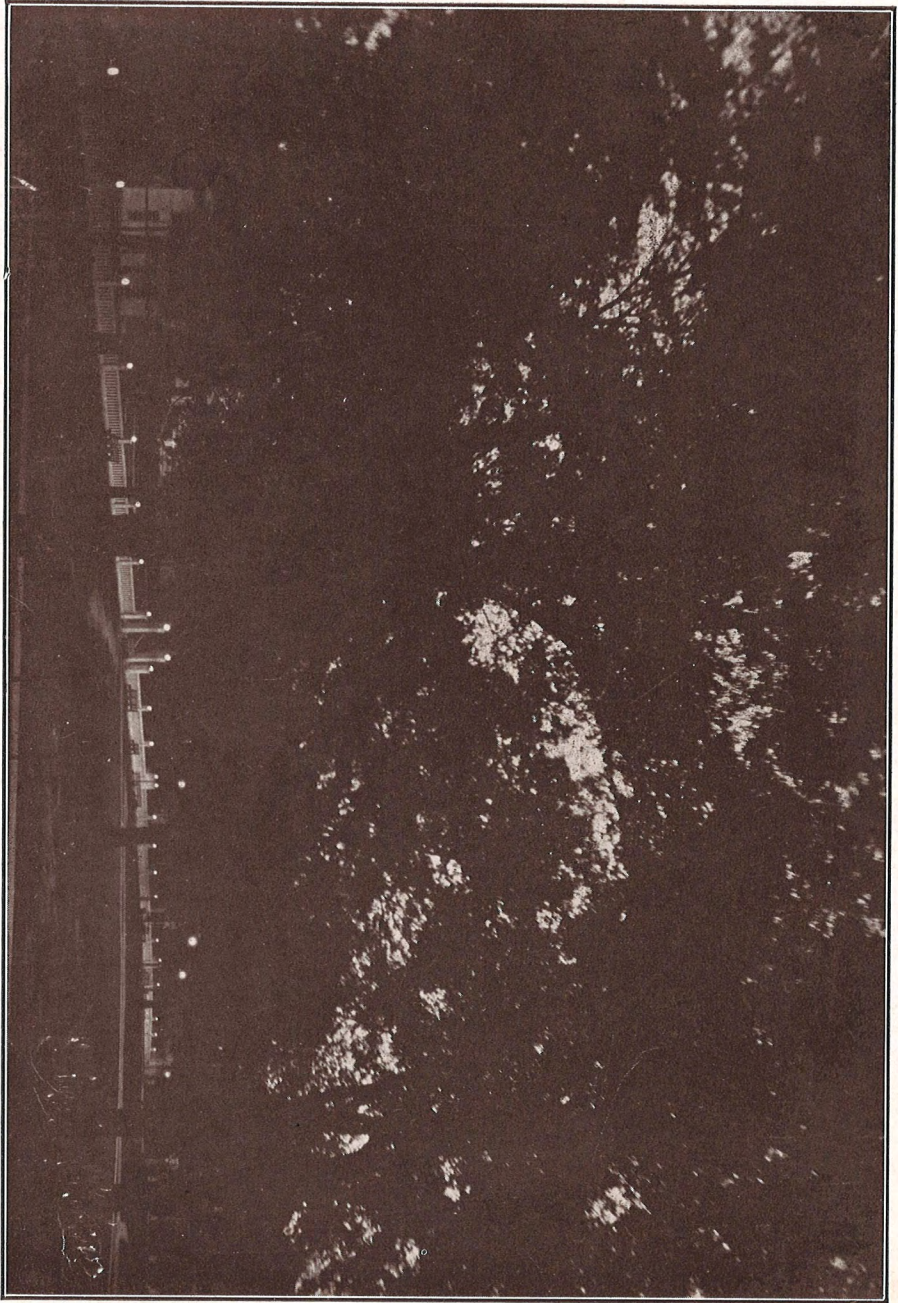

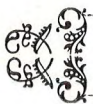

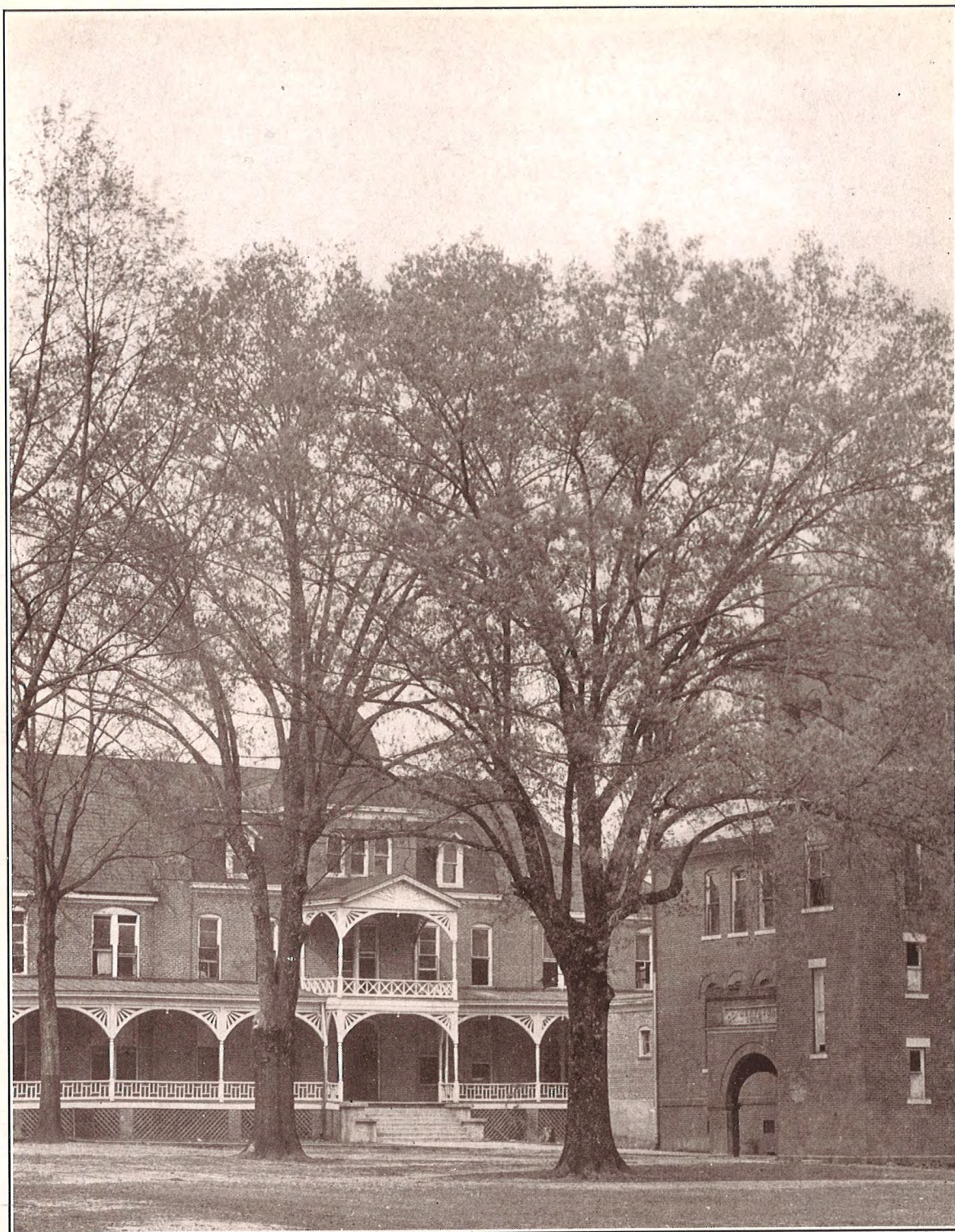
