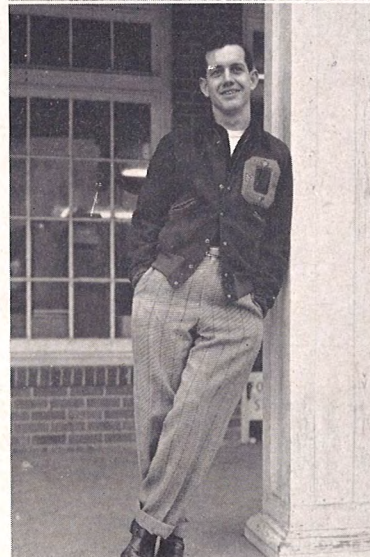

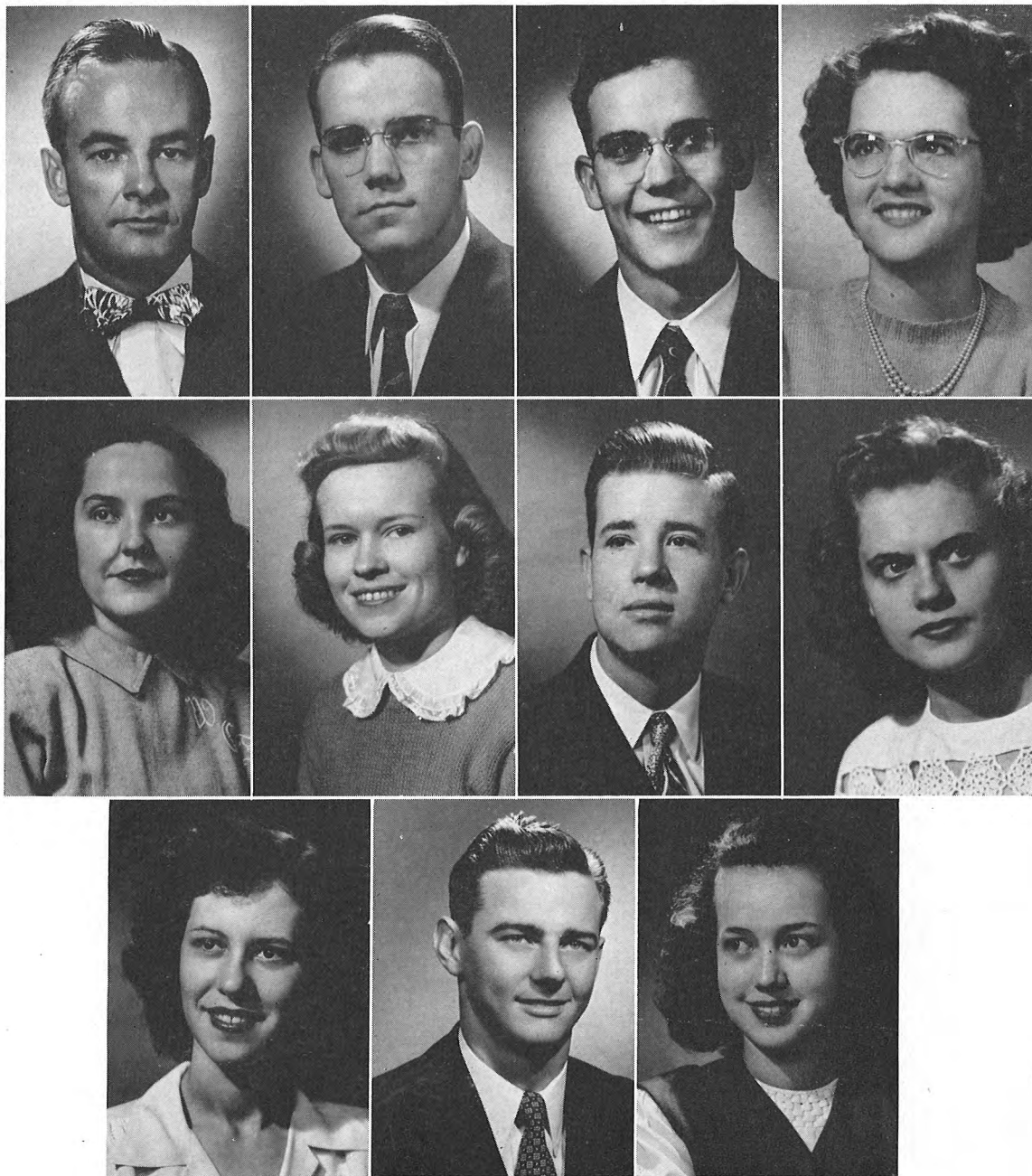

The requirements for election include the following:

I. CHARACTER: Character is a prerequisite. The student's record is to be considered before entering college, while in college, and the general reputation he enjoys among the students and faculty. One vote against a student on the grounds of character shall be sufficient to eliminate him from the list.

II. LEADERSHIP: in extra-curricular activities, i. e., Athletics, Society, Religion, Student Government.

III. SCHOLARSHIP: It is necessary to be of Junior Classification and an outstanding student, but the fact that he excels in all other phases may be considered in determining his qualifications.

IV. POTENTIALITIES:—of future usefulness to business and society.
