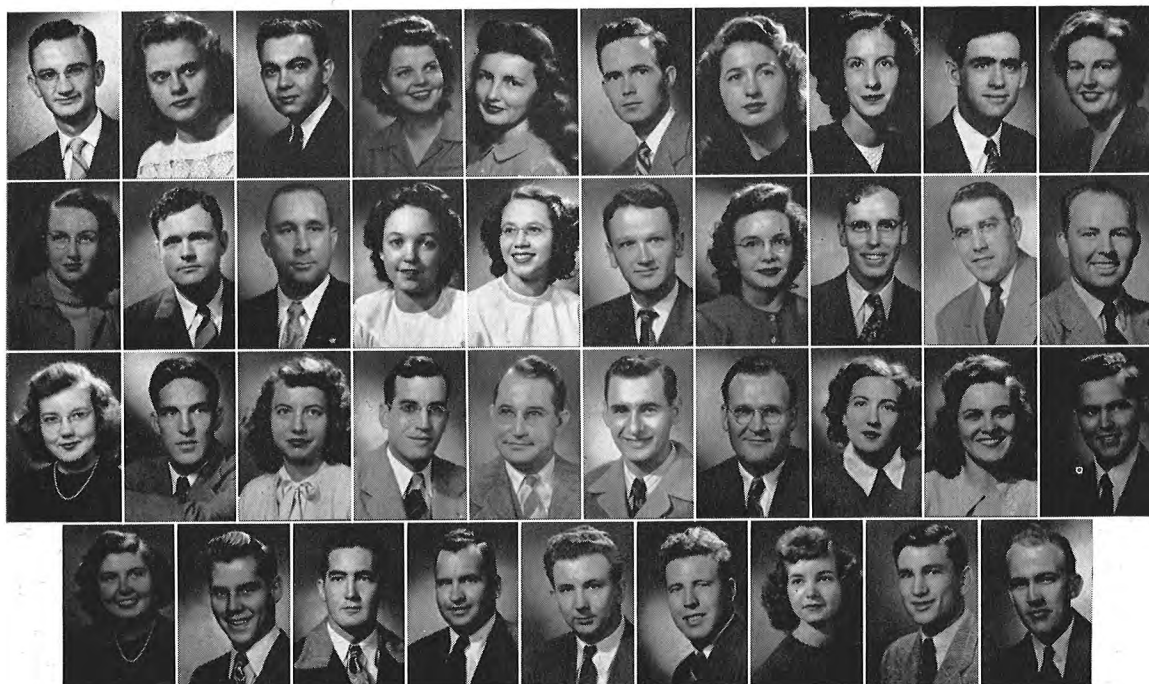

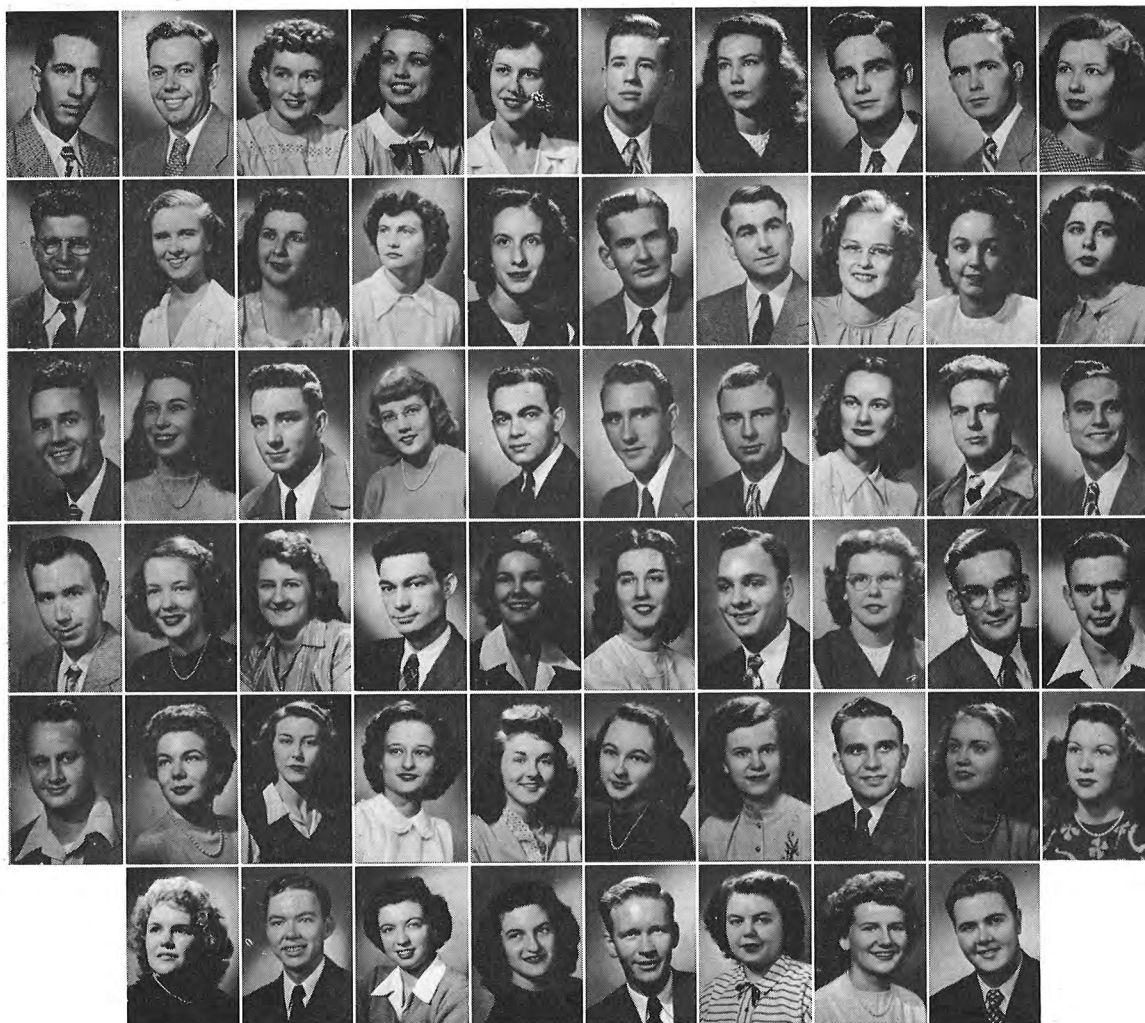

ALPHA PSI OMEGA

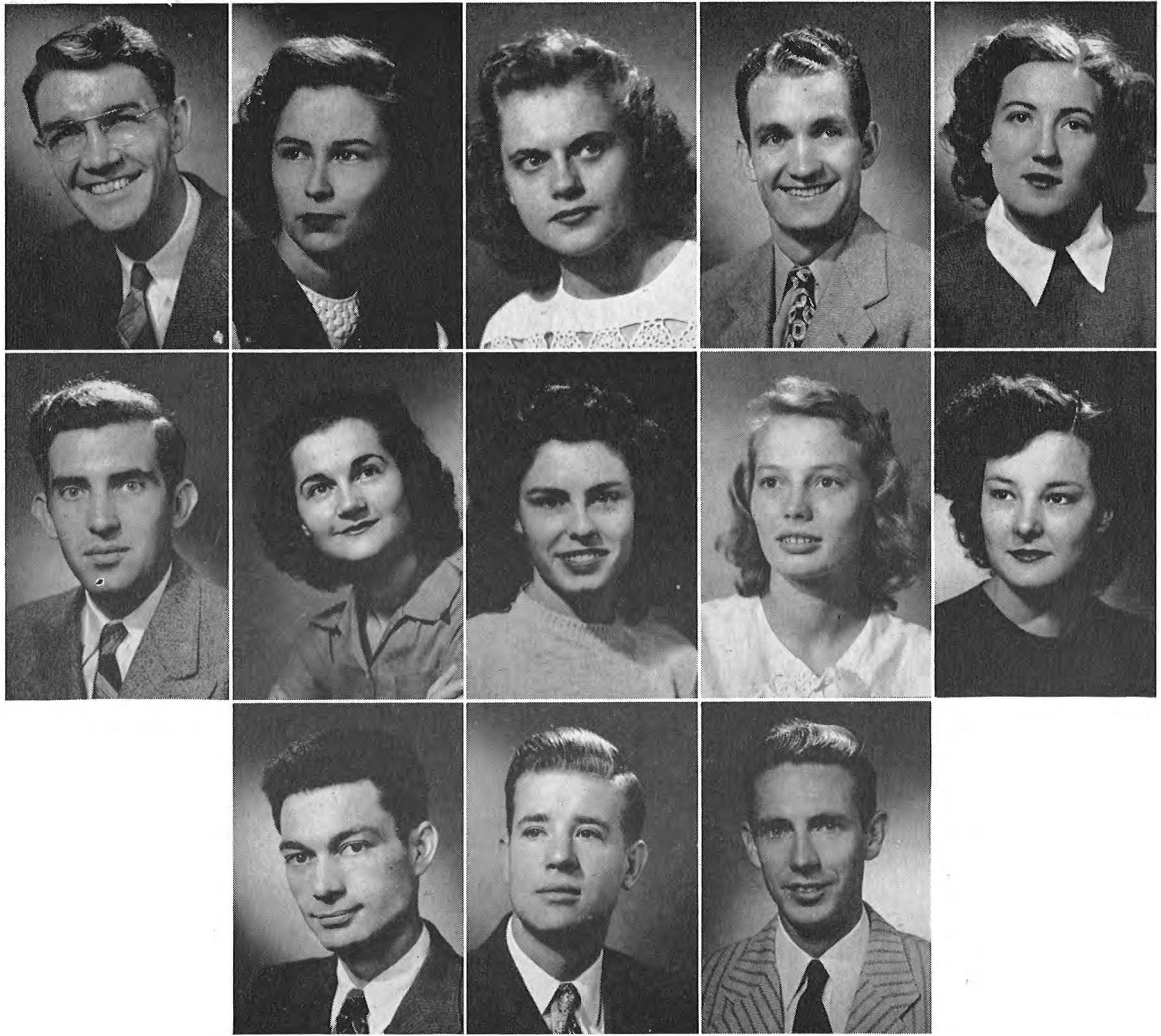

This year they painted the tiger on the press box of the stadium, the Ouachita Special signs for the buses and decorated the queens float for two parades.

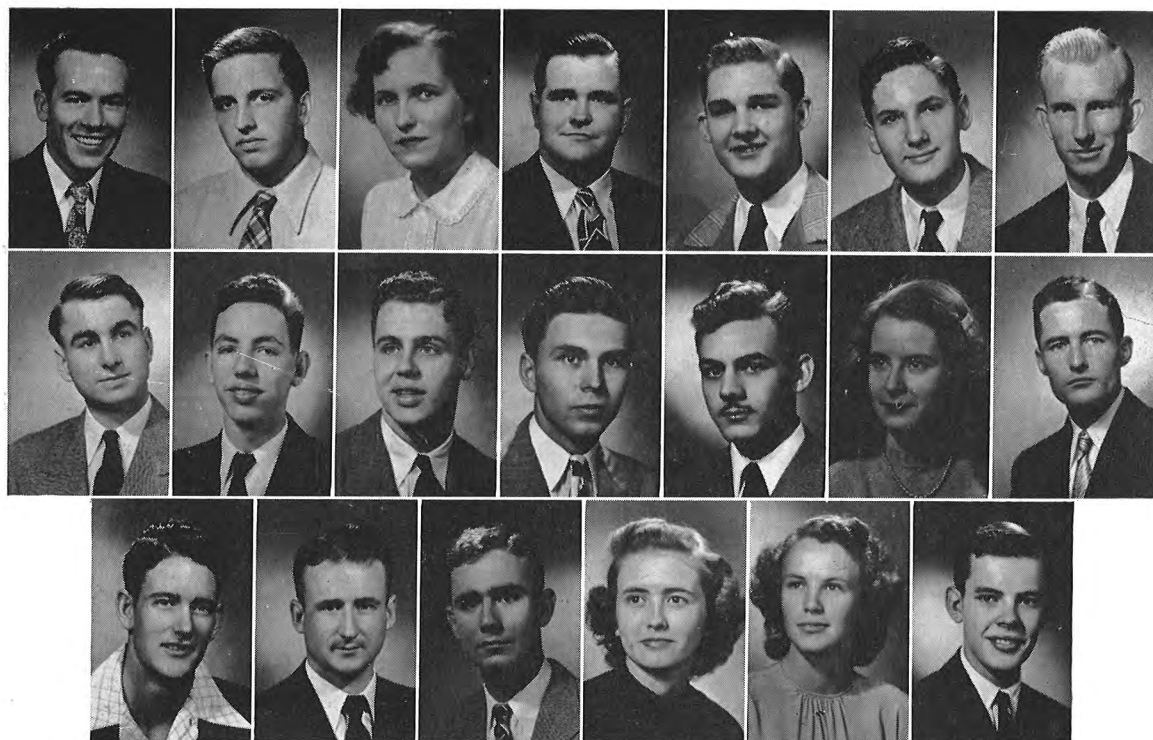

CHEMISTRY CLUB

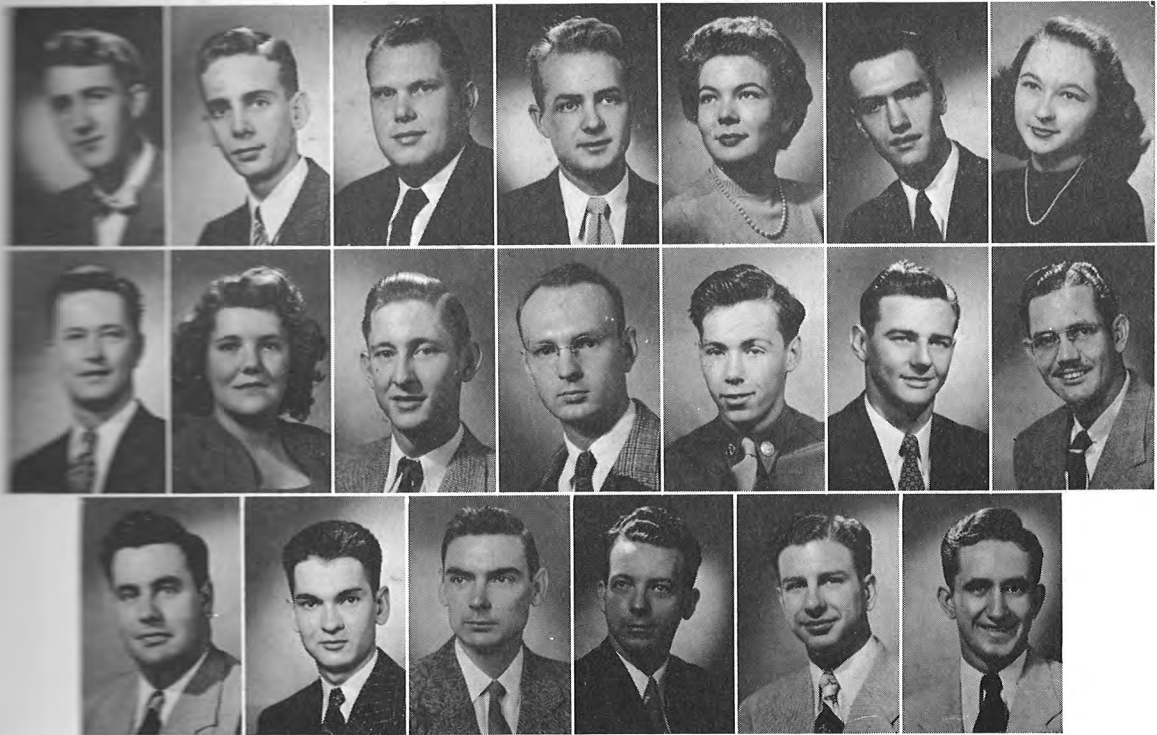

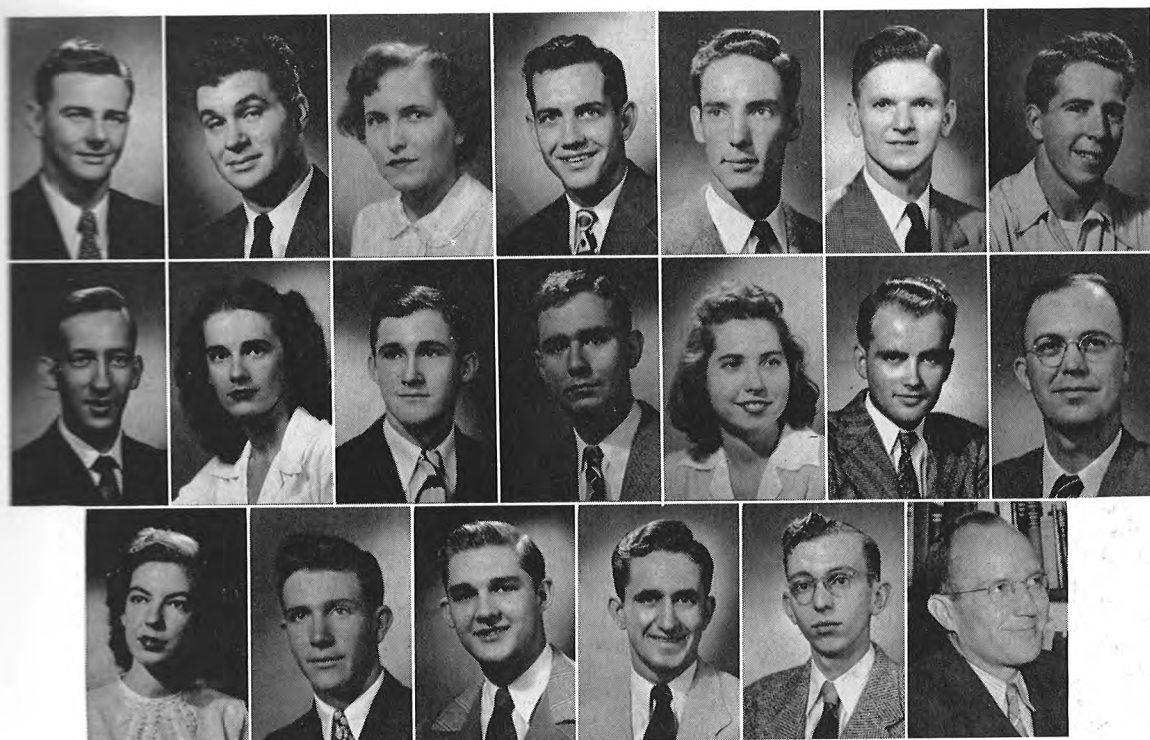

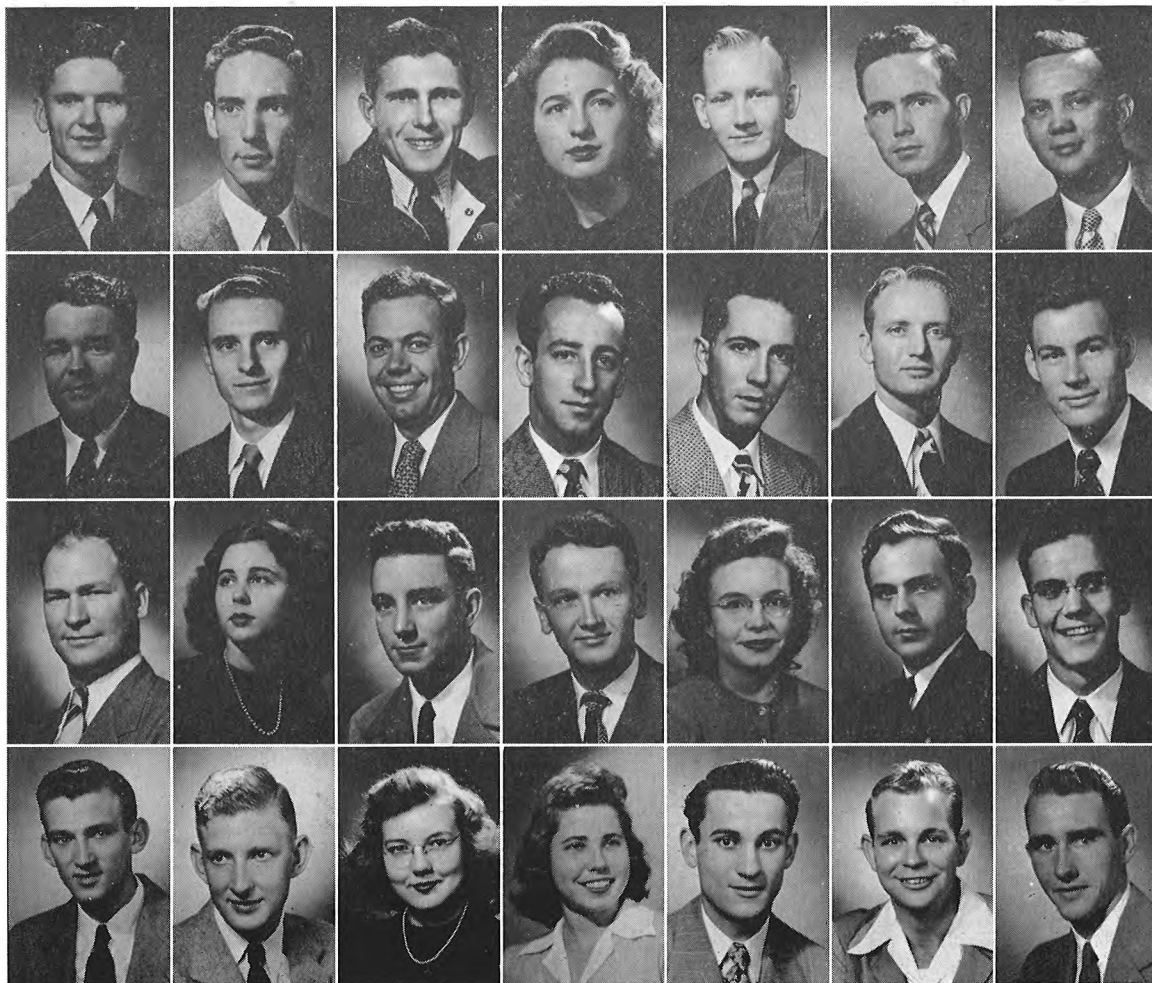
Meetings are held once each month in the math lecture room and programs on mathematics and its related field are presented.

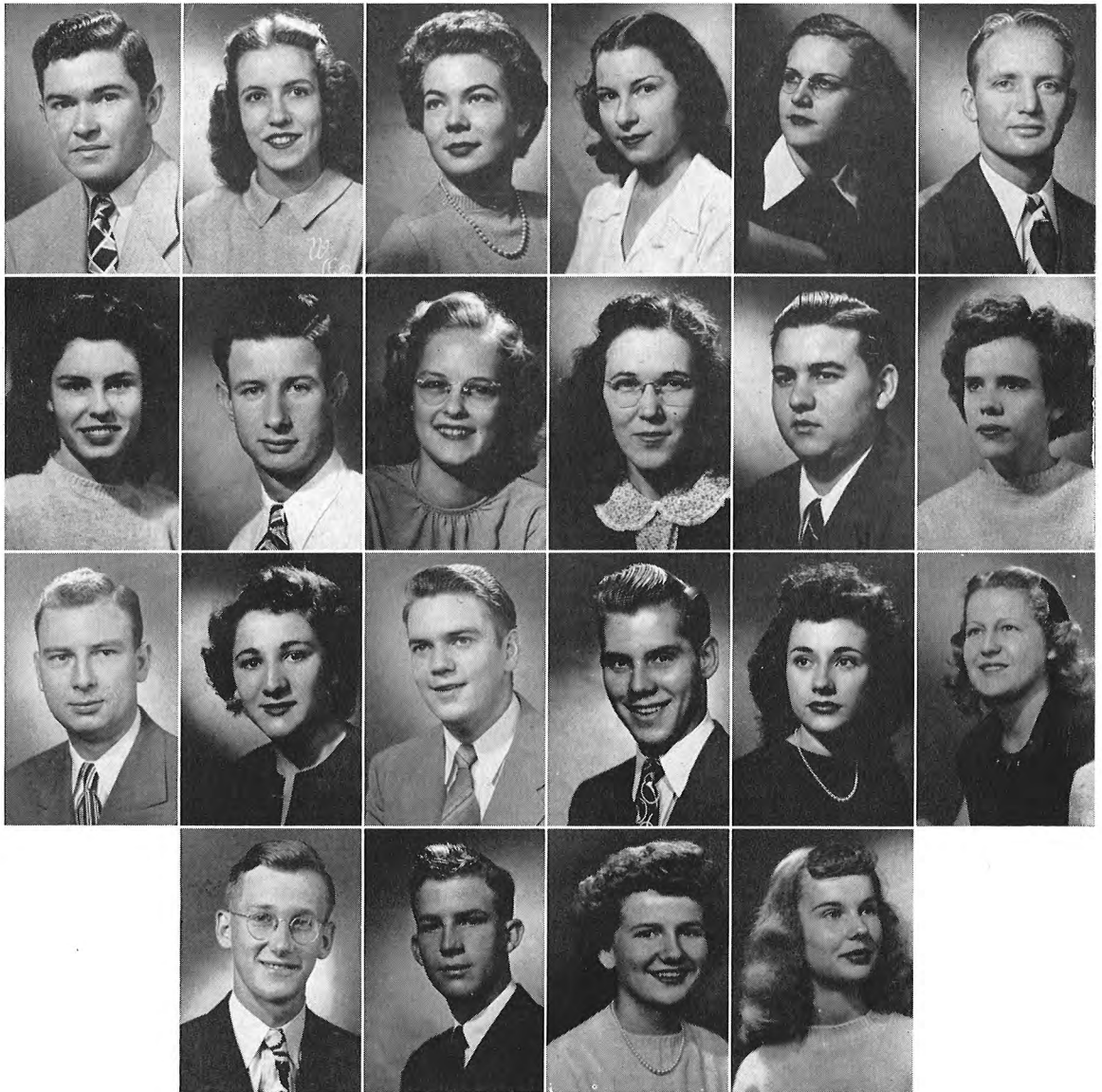

LIBRARY STAFF

The Ouachita College Library is situated in a central position on the campus. The book collection includes more than 26,000 accessioned volumes, 2,000 bound periodicals. The current magazine list totals 144. The main reading room houses the reference collection, while books for both supplementary and recreational reading are in the stacks. The new services added to the library this year include a browsing corner for leisure reading, an extension music library located in the conservatory, Mitchell Hall, a record and film collection. Emphasis has been placed on research and reference work for the students. A library handbook serves as a basis for training in the use of the library.

PHI BETA CHI

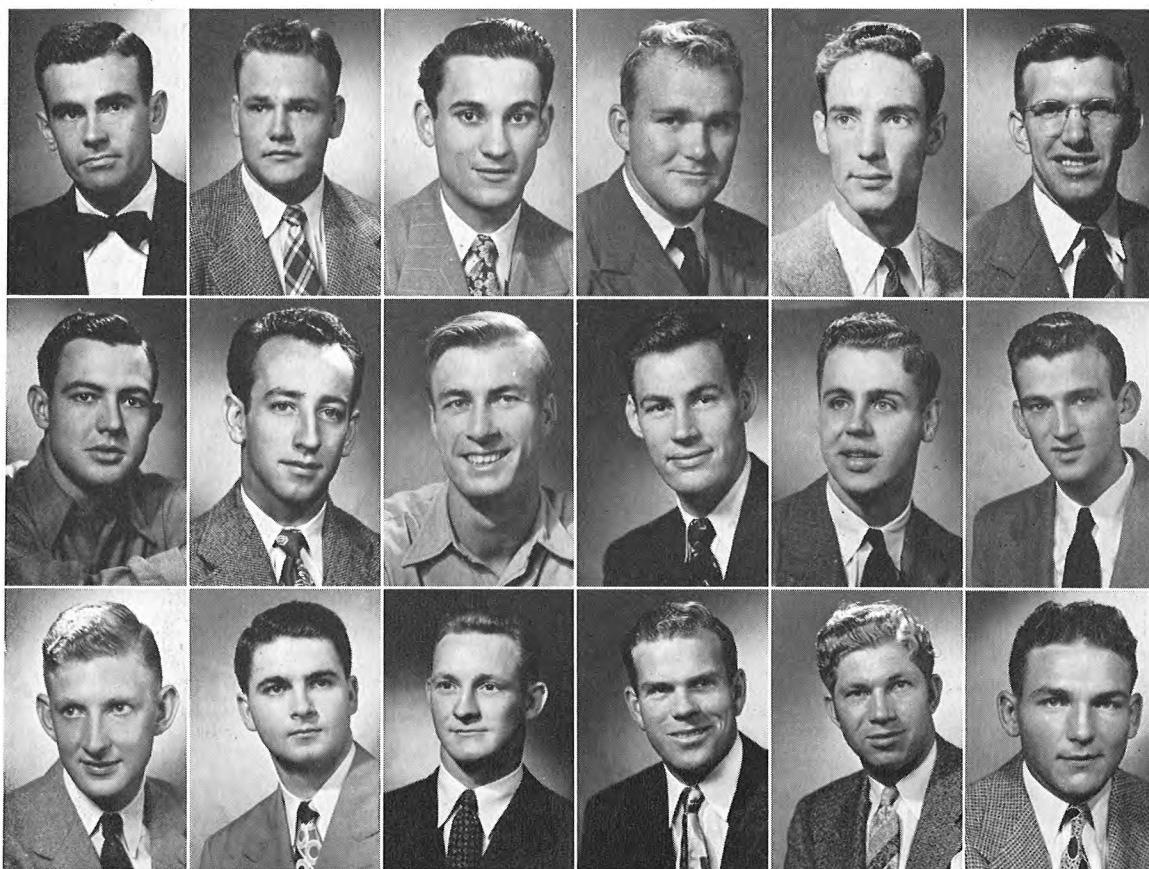

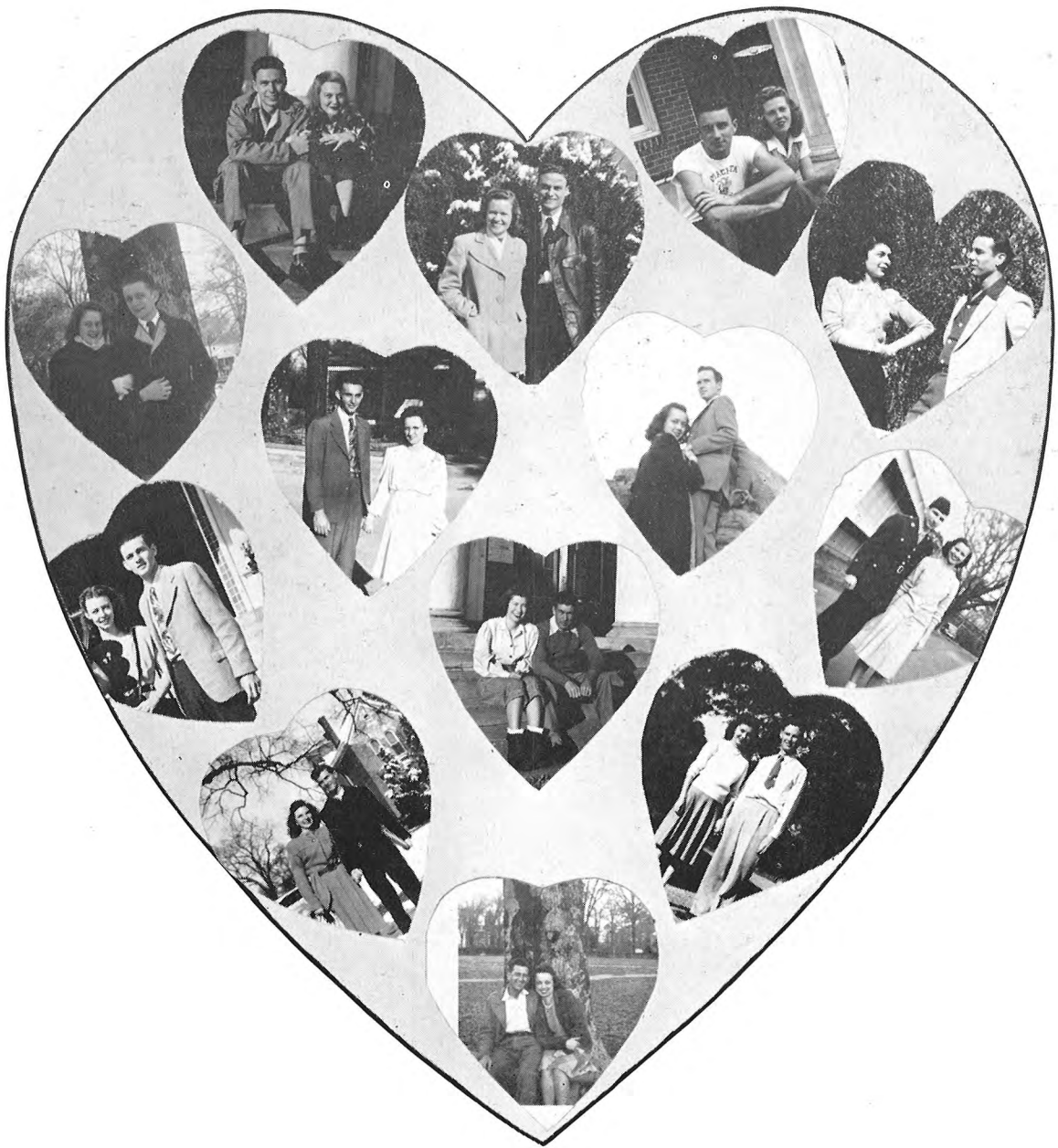
