BETA BETA

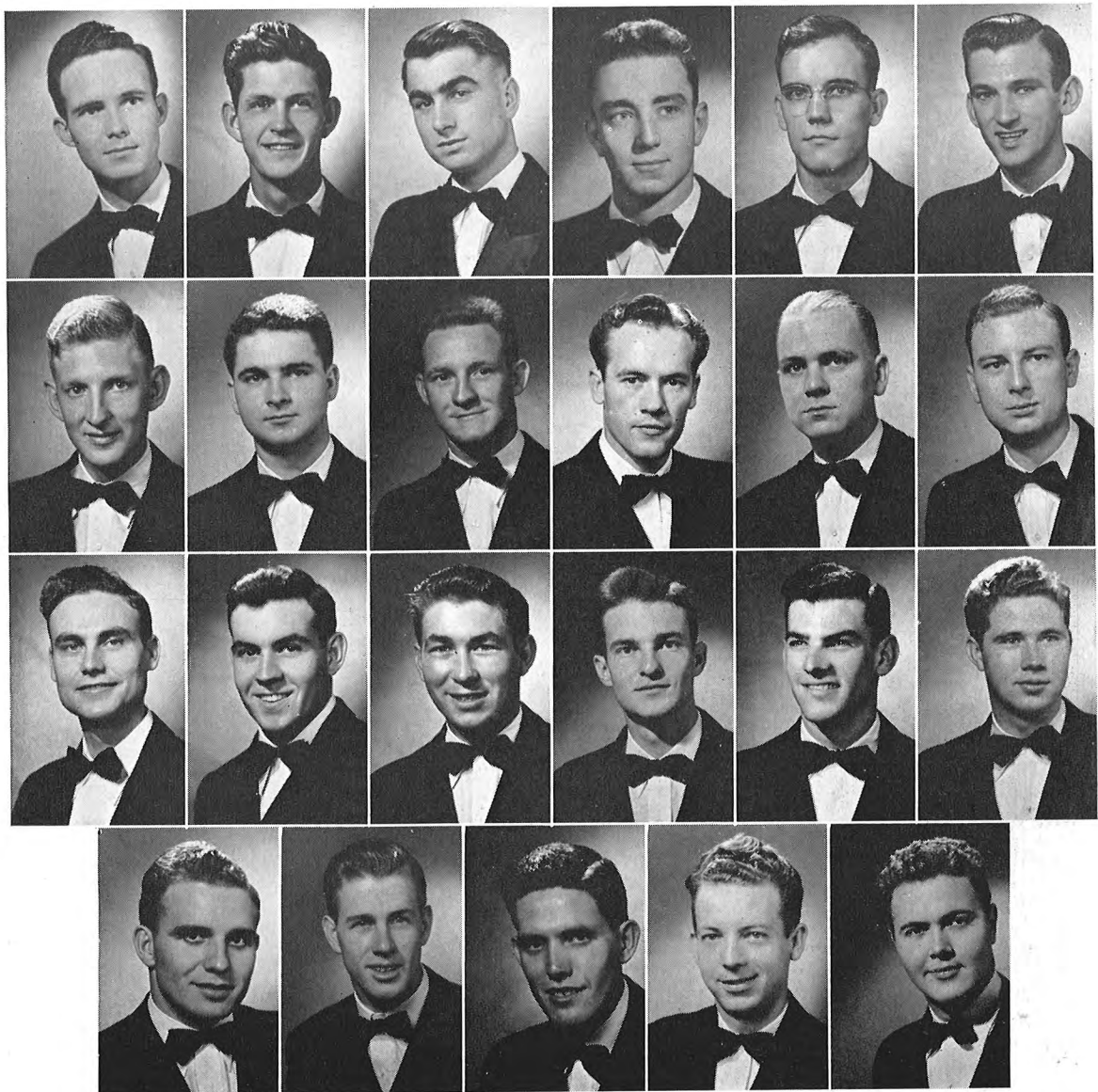

SIGMA ALPHA SIGMA

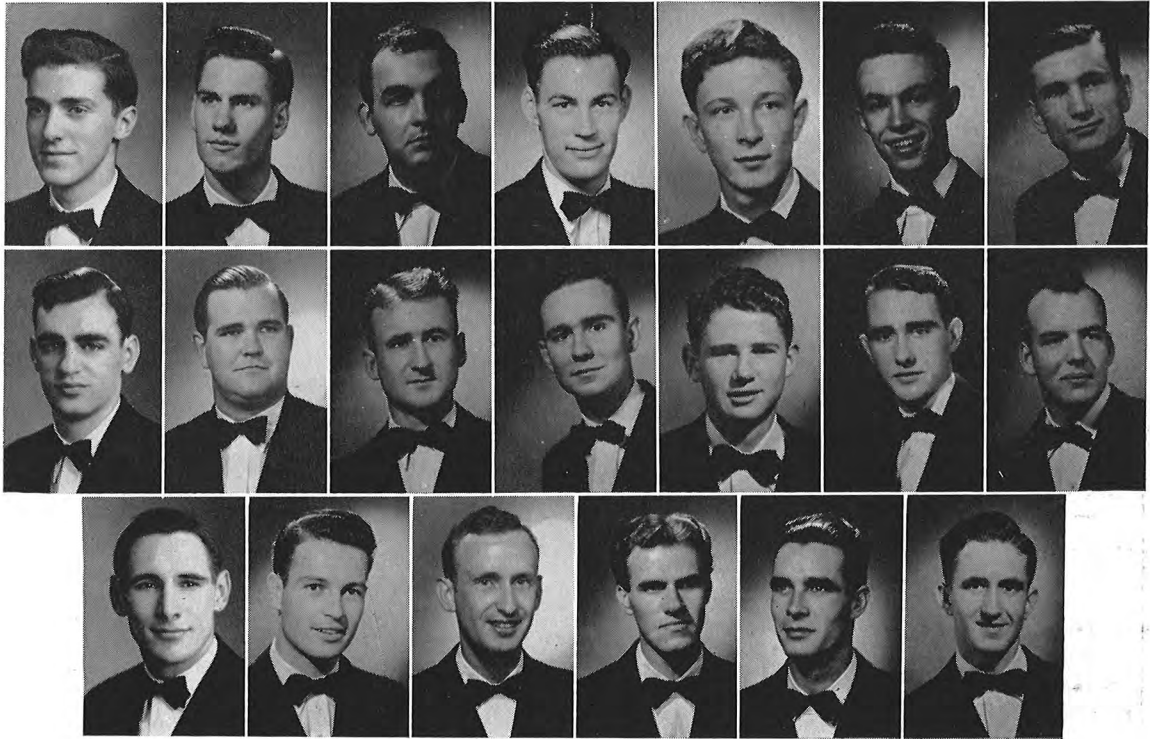

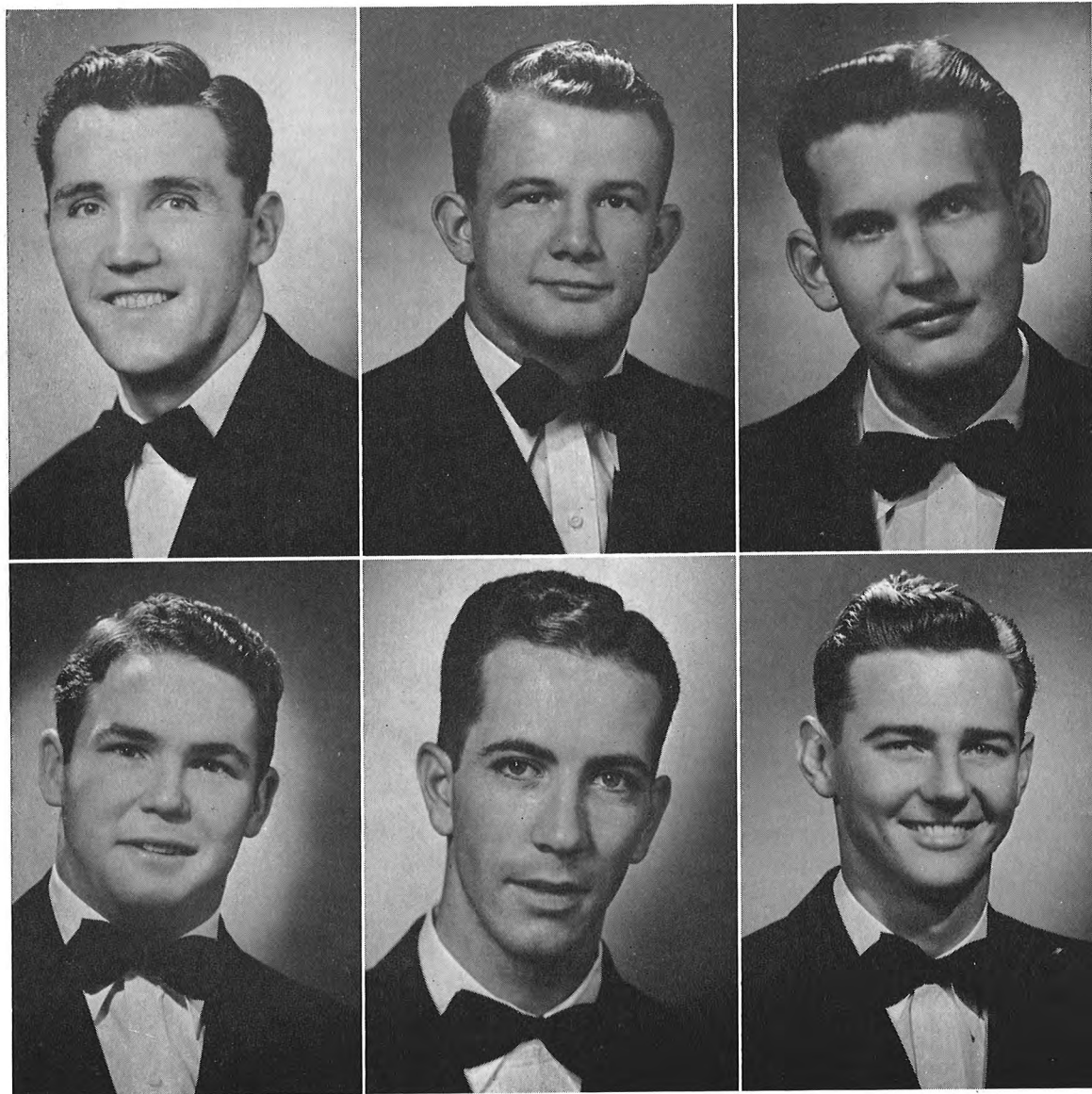

RHO SIGMA

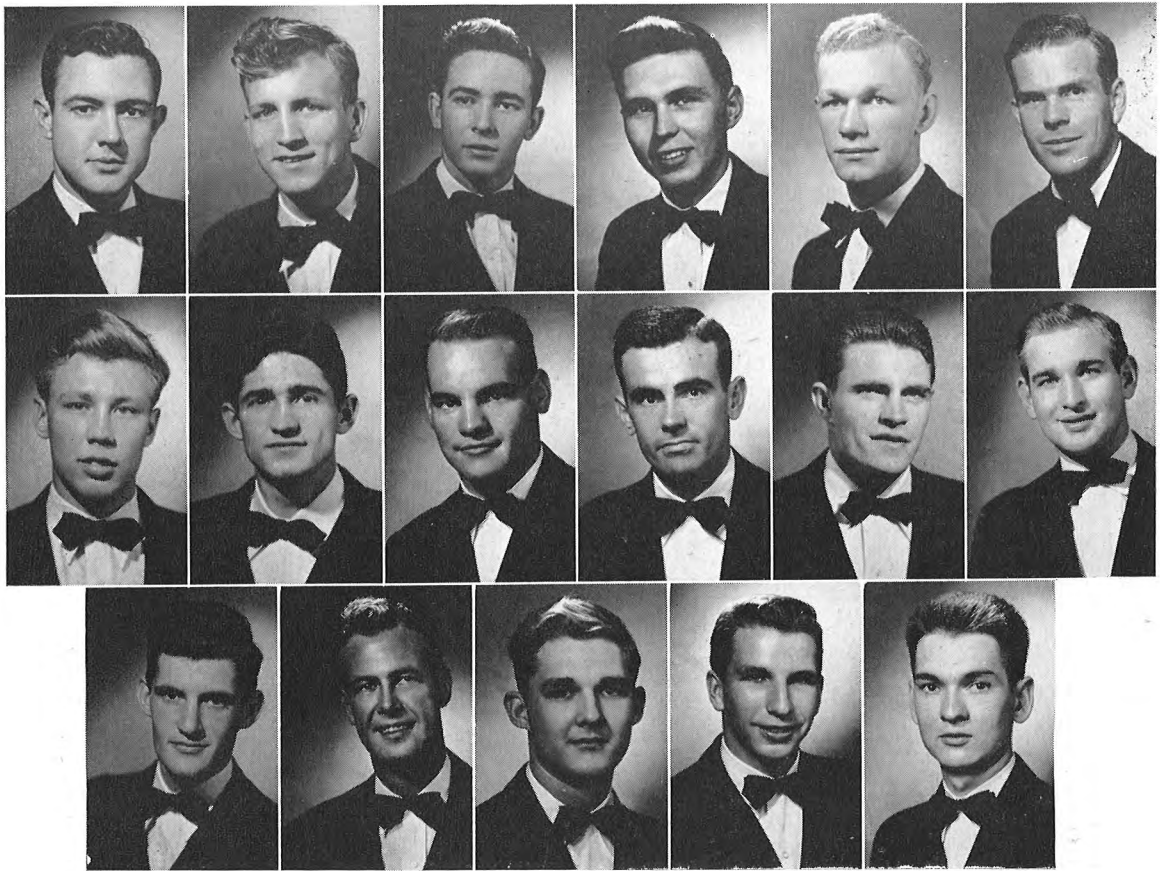
