Doug Lockard received the Bachelor of Music Education Degree from Henderson State University, the Master of Music in Trumpet Performance from the University of North Texas and is currently pursuing the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Performance at the University of Texas, Austin. He has taught in the public schools of Arkansas and Texas as a band director and private trumpet instructor. He has performed with the South Arkansas Symphony, Fort Smith Symphony, Garland Symphony, Irving Symphony, the Bluebonnet Brass Quintet and the South Arkansas Brass. As a soloist he has appeared with the Little Rock Wind Symphony and public school bands throughout Arkansas and Texas.

Ouida Keck received the Bachelor of Music Degree in Piano Performance from Ouachita Baptist University, the M.M. degree in Performance from the University of Arkansas, and the D.M.A. degree in Performance and Pedagogy from the University of Iowa. For the past twenty-six years she has taught piano, music appreciation and class piano on the college level as well as being a successful independent piano teacher. She was recently named the "Outstanding College Teacher of the Year" by the Arkansas State Music Teachers Association.
