Now is the time to file your ACT Family Financial Statement for the academic year, 1982-1983.

Mr. Johnson has set May 1 as <u>PRIORITY</u> DATE again this year. This means that all forms must be completed, processed by ACT, & received in the Financial Aid office by May 1. As processing takes about a month, forms should be filed as soon as possible after your/your parents' income tax forms for 1981 are ready. Be sure to do this before April 1, 1982.

State Scholarship deadline is June 27 - the ACT/FFS information must be received in the Little Rock State Scholarship office by then. Be sure to follow the instructions in the ACT/FFS folder for State Scholarship.

ACT/FFS packets can be picked up in the Student Financial Aid office during regular office hours.

Rush Information

The eight Social Clubs on our campus are concerned about making sure that each student is aware of the following rules pertaining to Rush.

- (1) To go through RUSH, a student must have a cummlative gpa of 2.00 or better. A freshman must have passed 12 hours during the last semester.
- (2) A transfer student must be in good academic standing (2.00 gpa or better and have passed 12 hours during his last semester in school.
- (3) Any student on disciplinary probation is not allowed to rush and pledge.
- (4) All students must sign a health release form giving the club permission to check the records for any physical concerns.
- (5) All students must sign up in advance. There will be a meeting of all female students on Wednesday, Feb. 10, at 5PM in Verser. Male students must sign up before 5PM on Friday, Feb. 19 in the Student Center Office.
- (6) There will be a nominal fee for all students going through RUSH.

OSF Scholarships

Each year the Ouachita Student Foundation awards a certain number of students with scholarships. Applications for OSF scholarships are now available in the OSF Office and the Financial Aids Office. <u>Every person</u> who will be a Junior or Senior in the Fall of 1982 is eligible for this scholarship. The scholarships are awarded according to academic standing, achievements, and need. Previous recipients <u>are</u> eligible for a new scholarship.
