The Artists

Assistant Professor Barry McVinney holds two graduate degrees in flute performance, a Doctor of Musical Arts from The University of Texas and a Master of Music from the University of Nebraska. He studied clarinet while earning a BA in music theory at Fredonia State College in New York. Dr. McVinney has performed on a variety of woodwind instruments across the United States and Canada as an orchestral musician for several Broadway musicals. Most recently he served as a substitute in the touring production of Les Miserables. Since joining the Ouachita Baptist University faculty four years ago Dr. McVinney has been in demand as a classical, jazz and theatrical musician around Arkansas, including performances with the Arkansas Symphony and Arkansas Repertory Theater.

David Allen Wehr, Ouachita Baptist University's Artist -in-Residence since 1994, has performed in thirty countries in Europe, North and South America and New Zealand since winning the gold Medal at the 1987 Santander International Piano Competition in Spain. Career highlights include his New York debut at the 92nd St. Y, London recital debut at Queen Elizabeth Hall and orchestral debut with the London Symphony, Vienna debut at the Musikverein, several appearances at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., and soloist with the Houston, Chautauqua and the major Spanish and Latin American orchestras. Last week, he played the Brahms and Schumann Quintets with the Moscow String Quartet in Madrid, Spain.

Diane McVinney is in her third season as second flutist of the Arkansas Symphony. She holds a Master of Music in flute performance from The University of Texas.
