THE ARTIST

Russell Hodges is Assistant Professor of Music in the Division of Music of the Bernice Young Jones School of Fine Arts at Ouachita Baptist University where he has taught since 1976. His teaching responsibilities are in the areas of organ, church music, and music theory. He is also director of the Ouachita Handbell Ringers and serves as the University's Music Librarian. In addition, he is actively involved in committee work and other campus activities. Hodges holds the Bachelor of Music degree with Honors from Oklahoma Baptist University and the Master of Music degree from the University of Oklahoma. Both degrees were earned with a major in organ performance. His organ teachers have been Virginia Denyer Reese and Mildred Andrews Boggess. In August of 1994 he was awarded the Master of Science degree in Library Science at the University of North Texas.

Hodges is a member of the American Guild of Organists, the American Association of University Professors, American Guild of English Handbell Ringers, the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada, the Organ Historical Society, and the Music Library Association. He also holds memberships in various professional and honor societies including the Omicron Delta Kappa Society, Pi Kappa Lambda, Kappa Kappa Psi, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity.

Hodges also serves as Director of Music/Organist for the First Presbyterian Church of Arkadelphia. His past church experience includes work as organist and handbell director in Arkansas and Oklahoma. He has done extensive performing and accompanying and has led workshops in organ and church music throughout the South and Southwest.
