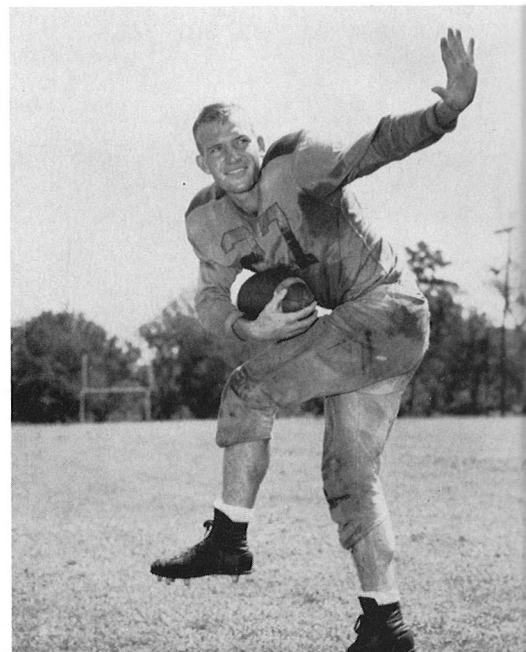
OUACHITA 7      MILLSAPS 0

### OUACHITA 7      A.S.T.C. 42

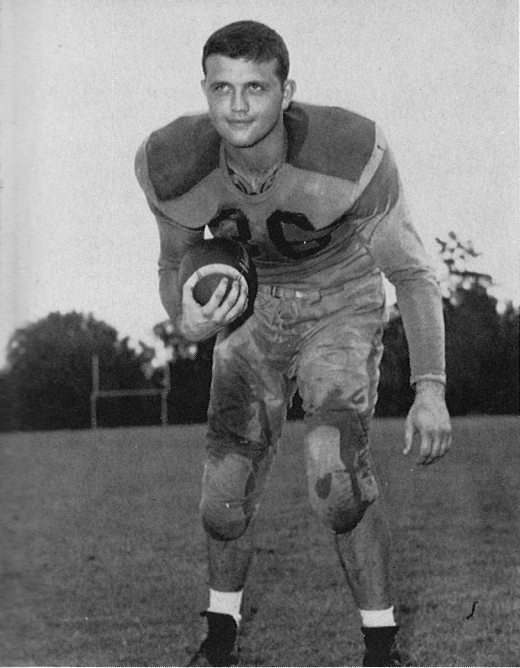

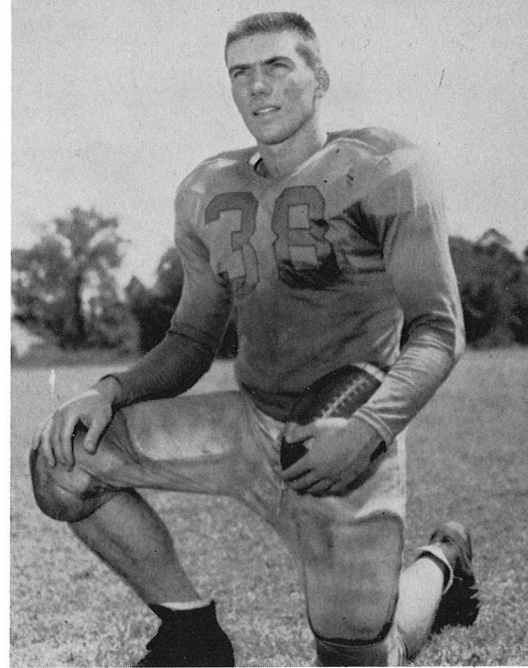

OUACHITA 6      MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE 28

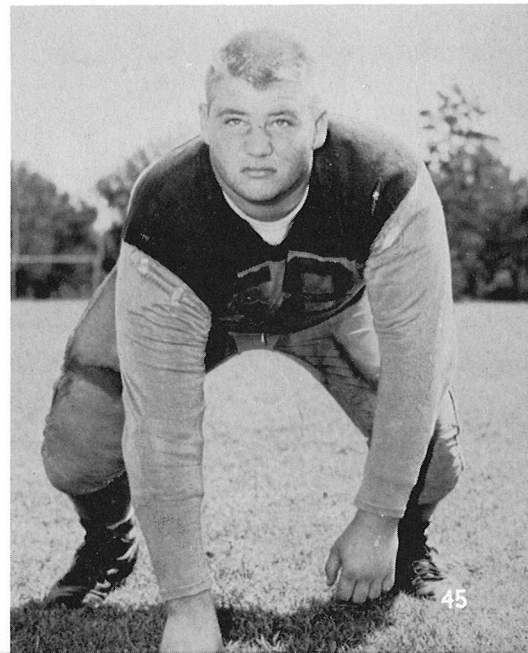

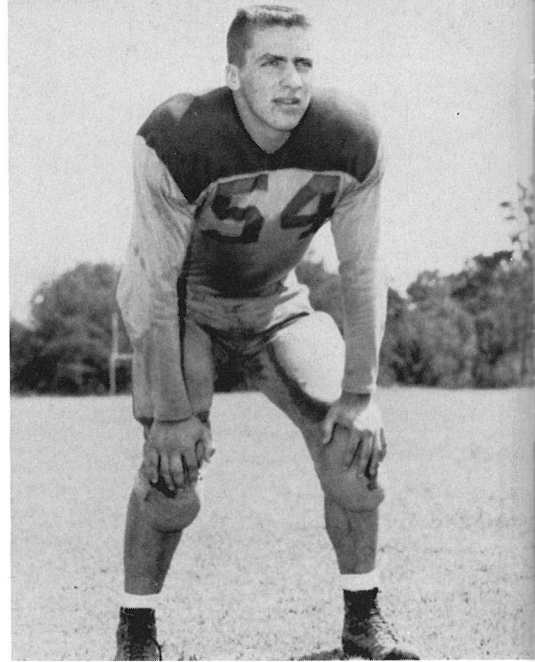

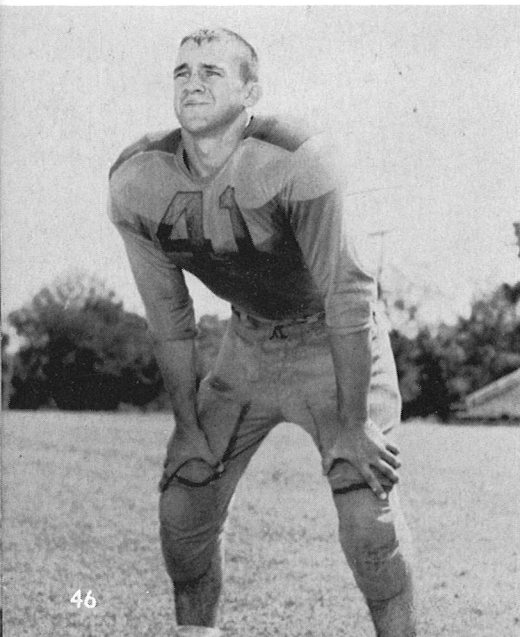

OUACHITA 6 COLLEGE OF THE OZARKS 40

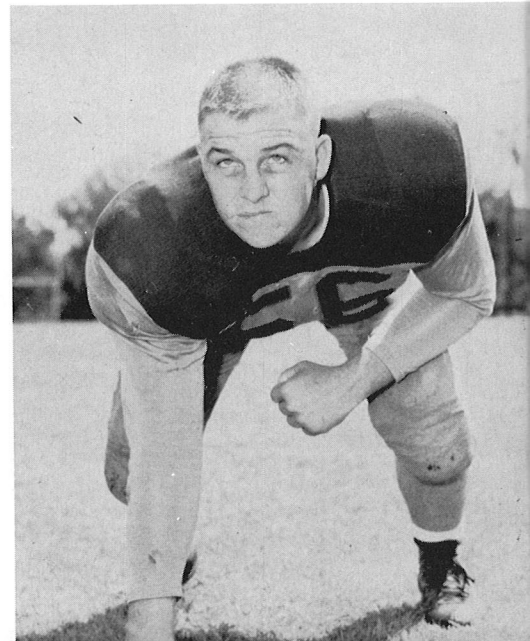
