

### **Biographical/Historical note**

Albert Roy Page was born September 16, 1891, in Dallas County, Arkansas, the son of Justin Smith Page and Mary Elizabeth Page. He served in the Army during World War I (WWI). Page married Lucy Dunlap, who died in 1938, then he married Annie Drue Garrett in 1944. A son, Thomas Roy Page was born to the couple in 1945. The Pages were active in Manning Baptist Church. Albert Page died March 25, 1956.
