In 2006 they made their highly acclaimed Carnegie Hall recital debut. Pas de Duo continues to be a favorite in concert series programs across the United States. They have been guest artists at the Chautaugua Institution, with the New York Philomusica, the Kurosawa Piano Music Foundation and the San Francisco International Music Festival, Pas de Duo can be heard on the New York Philomusica label in a live performance of Bartok's Sonata for Two Pianos and Percussion.

Mr. Varney and Ms Sanchez share a passion for working with young musicians and have conducted master classes and lectures at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, San Jose State University, Converse College, Holy Names University, Ouachita Baptist University, the South Carolina Governor's School, the National Federation of Music Clubs national conventions, and the Suzuki Music Association of California.
