The Artist

Pianist Naoki Hakutani is an assistant professor of piano at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, where he joined the faculty in 2008. Originally from Kent, Ohio, Dr. Hakutani holds degrees in piano performance from Northwestern University, Indiana University at Bloomington and the University of Texas at Austin. where he served as a Teaching Assistant in the Piano Department. In addition to teaching studio piano and group piano at UALR, Dr. Hakutani is the Director of the Artspree Concert Series and the Director of the UALR Piano Festival and is very active nationally and internationally as an educator, having conducted master classes throughout the United States, Mexico and Asia. Most recently, he presented master classes at The University of Wisconsin at River Falls, Suncheon University, Sejong University. Seoul Jangsin University and Honam Theological University.

Dr. Hakutani is very active as a solo and collaborative pianist, including joint appearances with his wife, Dr. Jaeyeon Park-Hakutani, as well as performing with *The Three Pianists*. He has also performed as a soloist and collaborator across the United States as well as Mexico, Japan, Korea and Taiwan. Recent performances include an appearance with the Korea Sinfonietta Youngsan Art Hall in Korea as well as a lecture recital on the music of Franz Liszt as the Seoul National University of Education. Hakutani has also recently appeared in recital Southeast Missouri State University, University of Missouri Columbia and Universidad de Ciencias y Artes de Chiapas Mexico.

He was a prizewinner of the Young Texas Artists Competition 2001 and was the pianist of the Auberon Trio, which in 2005 received Second Prize at the WRR Chamber Music Competition Dallas, Texas sponsored by Chamber Music International.
