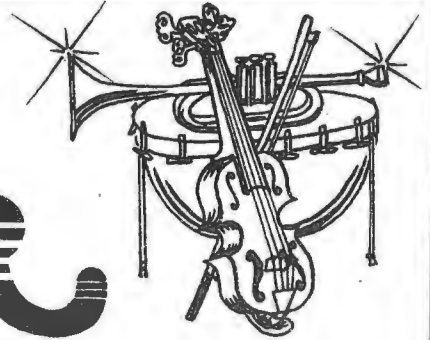

CENTENNIAL SUMMER AT OUACHITA!

■ Summer School at Ouachita Baptist University is a different kind of experience. Students enjoy the relaxed atmosphere, the closer rapport with faculty and the concentrated focus on one or two classes. Many take General Education courses to ease fall and spring class schedules; others take an elective just because it sounds interesting. Whatever the reason, students find summer at Ouachita is anything but dull. Ouachita's Centennial Summer 1986 promises to be a most exciting one.

The primary emphasis of Ouachita's summer session is on its academic program. With an average class load of six hours, students and faculty can focus attention more clearly on selected topics. The result is often one of the most rewarding experiences in a student's college career.

Because classes begin at 7 am students may complete classes in the morning, thus leaving the remainder of the day for research, study or leisure activities. The pace is fast-classes meet every day, Monday through Thursday-but the atmosphere is casual, so the pressure is not overly intense.

Although most classes are lecture-discussion, a wide range of courses is offered. For example, the very popular "Old Washington Seminar" is an on-site class meeting in Washington, Arkansas. The Religion Department will conduct a unique course entitled "OBU Around the World." This is an expression of our commitment to world-wide mission ministry. It is designed to provide the student with a mission experience in cross-cultural living, ministry, and communication of his faith. A strategic section of the world will be highlighted each year. China is the focus for 1986. Also, a new physical education course, "Recreation Sports," will take advantage of Lake DeGray and will include activities such as water skiing, canoeing, sail boating, fishing and beach games. It will allow students to meet activity requirements.

In keeping with the biblical picture of the Christian life as a journey which is both inward and outward, the Baptist Student Union will sponsor several activities in the summer of 1986. Worship, Bible study, fellowship, missions, social ministry and more will all be a part of the summer schedule at Ouachita.

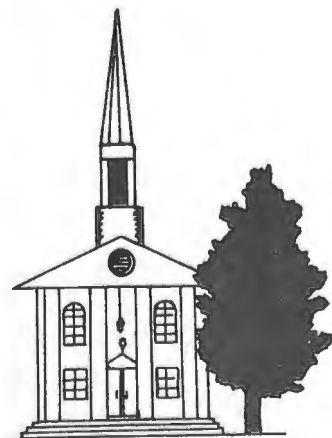


SUMMER STUDENT ACTIVITIES
