The Ouachita Baptist University drama department will Sponsor its third annual "Day of Play" for approximately 1,100 church youth group members and sponsors from Arkansas and surrounding states on Saturday, April 26 and Saturday, May 3.

"The 'Day of Play' is actually a play on words and refers to the dramatization of the musical 'Godspell' which will be performed by OBU and Henderson State University students at 9 a.m. and 11 a.m.," said Dr. Roy Buckelew, Chairman of the Speech, Drama, and Speech Pathology Department at Ouachita.

In addition to viewing the theatre presentation in Verser Drama Center, the registrants will have the opportunity of participating in a period of individual and team recreation in the Sturgis Physical Education Center at OBU. Lunch for the youth group members and sponsors will be served in Birkett Williams Hall, free of charge.

Scott Holsclaw, instructor of speech and drama at Ouachita, is the director of OBU's production of "Godspell." The school's admissions counseling office will be in charge of registration and general arrangements. The School and Community Recreation class at OBU will coordinate the recreational and physical activities. The instructor for the class is Tona Wright, Associate Professor of Physical Education at OBU. The activities will include volleyball, basketball, racquetball and other sports.

Registration for the "Day of Play" at OBU begins at 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. in the lobby of Verser Drama Center, and the cost for the play is \$1.
