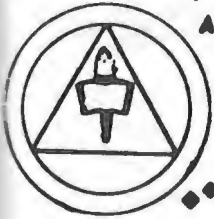

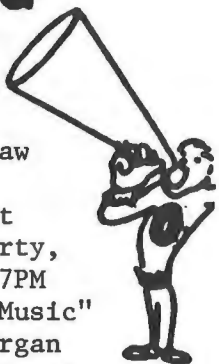
Attention! Attention!

You are reminded that Ouachita has established a financial aid priority date of May 1, 1980 for the 1980-81 school year. This means that ACT Family Financial Statements received and processed by ACT Program by that date will receive full consideration for all available financial aid. Those processed after that date will be considered if money is available for funding from the respective programs. ACT packets are available in the Student Financial Aid Office.

We have received many of the results of the Family Financial Statement submissions to ACT. The most common mistake being made is the failure to enter the code for the Arkansas State Scholarship Program, for those who are eligible. Eligible applicants who did not apply must do so or lose up to \$300 in financial assistance. The deadline for State Scholarship is July 1, 1980, however the lead time for getting the information to the State Program will be up to six weeks. You should apply not later than May 15.

If you plan to attend Summer School and are eligible to work on the College Work-Study Program you should have filled out a work application. If you have not done so, go to the Student Financial Aid Office and complete one this week.

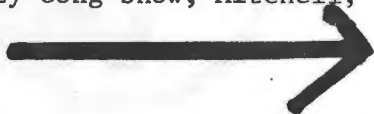
