1985-86 will be a very special year, for it will be the academic year that we celebrate the cencennial of Ouachita. There are many special



ALL STUDENTS MUST OFFI-CIALLY CHECK IN WITH THE HEAD RESIDENT OF HIS/HER DORMITORY. At the time of check-in, you will receive your room door key. Remember to bring \$5, \$4 of which will go into the dormitory fund for activities there and \$1 will go to the RA Council for special dorm projects. This \$5 does <u>NOT</u> pay for the key.
