YOUNG ARTIST WINNER OF 1991

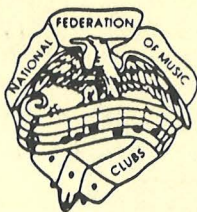
Richard Glazier, 28-year-old pianist, is a native of Indianapolis, Indiana. He has performed extensively throughout the United States and has received many awards, including the Cleveland Institute of Music's 1991 Arthur Loesser Memorial Award for Excellence and the Institute's Piano Solo Competition. He was an award winner in the 1989 Joanna Hodges Piano Competition in Palm Desert, California; 1989 semi-finalist in the New Orleans Piano Competition; and the 1988 first place winner in the Indiana Music Teachers Association Competition. He recently won the Director's Prize in the 1991 New Orleans Piano Competition.

He will be featured as a soloist with the Owensboro, Kentucky Symphony Orchestra in 1991-1992. He has performed in the Indiana University Orchestra, the International String Quartet, has played in numerous master classes, and was heard in 1991 over National Public Radio in "Music from the Cleveland Institute."

A former student of Menahem Pressler and Leonard Hokanson at the Indiana University School of Music where he was associate instructor, he is currently a doctoral candidate at the Cleveland Institute of Music under the direction of Thomas Hecht.

Glazier received the \$5,000 NFMC Award in Piano, the Lucille Parrish Ward Piano Award of \$1,000, the Edwin B. Ellis Award of \$1,000, the Samuel Soren Award of \$1,000, and the Claudette Sorel Award of \$150.

He brings maturity and brilliance to his performances.
