Ouachita Singers is a auditioned choral ensemble of approximately 48 students representing the Ouachita Baptist University Division of Music in a range of concerts each year in schools and churches throughout Arkansas, the surrounding region, and across North America. Recent travels have included performances at the White House and in Central Europe. In February 1998 the Singers will be performing by invitation for the Arkansas Music Educators and Arkansas Choral Directors Associations in Pine Bluff. Their musical selections range from the masterworks of choral literature to folk music to music of the contemporary church. They have also produced a well-received series of compact disc recordings

Former members of the Ouachita Singers have gone on to successful careers representing Ouachita everywhere from public school classrooms and churches to New York concert hall stages and Nashville recording studios. Wherever they go, they take with them the Ouachita heritage of both academic and Christian excellence.

Dr. Fuller, a native of North Little Rock, Arkansas, brings to his work degrees in choral music from Baylor University, West Texas State University, and Arizona State University as well as post-graduate work at Westminster Choir College and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. He is active as a clinician and adjudicator throughout the Southwest. Active also as a writer and researcher, he has written for The Choral Journal, participated in working groups for both the American Choral Directors Association and the International Federation for Choral Music, and has created editions of early music published by Alliance Music Publications. He currently serves on the Executive Council of the Southern Baptist Church Music Conference, the Choral Net Advisory Group, and is Treasurer-Elect of the Southwestern Division of the American Choral Directors Association.

Mrs. Cindy Fuller is an adjunct instructor for the Ouachita School of Music whose duties include applied voice and piano and accompanying. She holds two degrees in voice from Baylor University and a Master of Music degree from Sam Houston State University. Her previous experience includes public school music, numerous church positions and founding the Marshall, Texas Community Children's Chorus. In addition to her university duties she is organist at First Baptist Church in Arkadelphia, Arkansas.
