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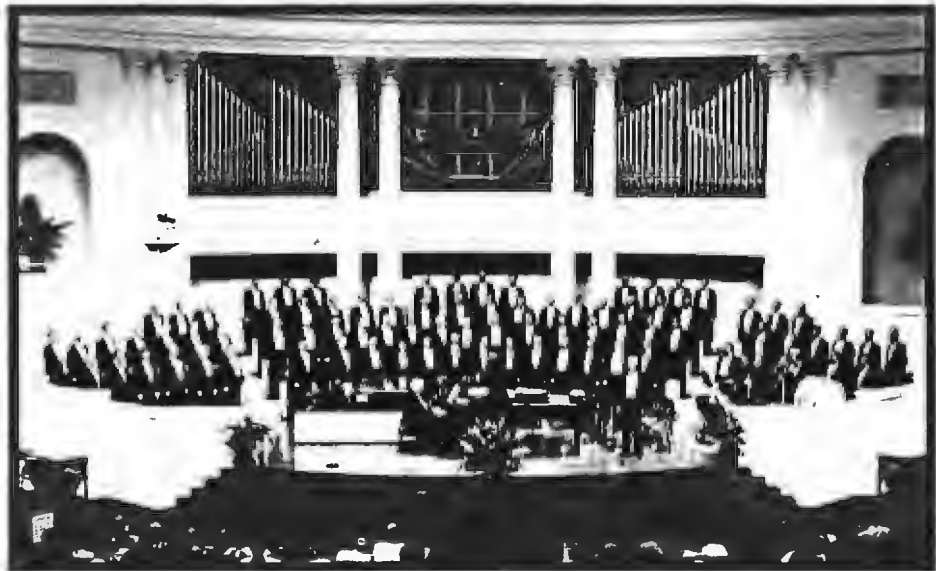

**Buryl Red**, the Musical Director of **The CenturyMen**, is a noted composer, arranger, and producer. He has been with **The CenturyMen** since its beginning and arranges most of the music the choir performs. Born in Little Rock, Arkansas, he founded BR Productions and Generic Music in New York City as the center of his professional activities. He is a graduate of Baylor University and Yale University and had been author, consultant, and producer of some of this country's most widely used school music textbooks, including *The Music Connection*. He co-produced the off-Broadway musical *Violet*, winner of the New York Critics Award for Best Musical in 1997. He and Joseph Joubert received a Drama Desk Nomination for Outstanding Orchestration of *Violet*. Buryl Red's work has been described in the Washington Post as "uncommonly creative."

**Max Lyall**, the pianist for **The CenturyMen**, has recently retired from Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary in Mill Valley, CA. Currently, Dr. Lyall is serving as Music Minister at Woodbrook Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland. A native of Oklahoma, Max received his bachelor of music degree from Oklahoma Baptist University, the master of music degree from the University of Oklahoma and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in piano from Peabody Conservatory of Music at John Hopkins University. He has done additional study at Juilliard School of Music. Dr. Lyall has been a piano and harpsichord soloist with the Nashville Symphony and Chamber Orchestras, as well as a piano soloist with the Nashville Pro Musica Chorus and Orchestra. He is a featured artist on the Word recording "Keyboard Legends" along with Fred Bock, Kurt Kaiser, and Don Wyrzten. In addition to his work with **The CenturyMen**, he has appeared as pianist and accompanist for Cynthia Clawson, Robert Hale, Dean Wilder, and Henrietta Davis. He has written and arranged a number of works appearing in Southern Baptist publications. His works appear in the Triune and Lorenz catalogs as well.



**Joseph Joubert**, accompanist/co-arranger, for **The CenturyMen**, has been producer, arranger, orchestrator, and keyboardist for artist such as Patti Labelle, Ashford & Simpson, Jennifer Holliday, Nona Hendrix, Whitney Houston, Cissy Houston, Diana Ross, George Benson, Tremaine Hawkins, Wintley Phipps, Aaron Hall, and Judy Collins. He was orchestrator for *The Music Connection* CD series. He has worked in Broadway musicals as musical supervisor/orchestrator for the *Truly Blessed*, associate conductor/pianist for *Five Guys Named Moe* and *Big River*. Dance music arranger/pianist for *A Chorus Line*, the movie and portrayed Jasbo Brown in the Metropolitan Opera production of *Porgy and Bess*. As musical director for the Gala of New York's Shakespeare Festival, he worked with Kathleen Battle, Kevin Kline, Wynton Marsalis, Melba Moore, Ben Vereen, Mandy Patinkin and Christopher Walken.

**John Campbell** is Professor of Organ and Church Music and heads the Department of Performance Studies of the School of Music at Hardin-Simmons University, Abilene, TX. John is also organist at First Baptist Church, Abilene, TX. He was formerly on the faculty of Berea College, Berea, KY. John has studied with Mildred Andrews, Arthur Poister, Russell Saunders, and Michael Schneider. He has been heard in solo organ recitals in the U.S. and Germany, and he has extensive experience accompanying choral organizations in the U.S., South America, and Western Europe. John joined **The CenturyMen** as organist in 1995.

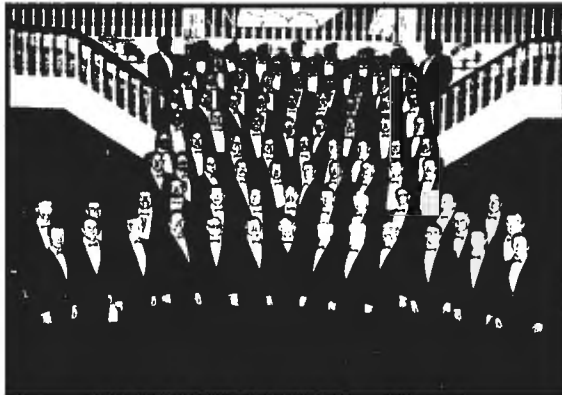
