Surprise, Suprise: College Costs Rise

The cost of college is up 8 to 10 percent for resident students and 12 to 14 percent for commuters at four-year colleges this year, The College Board reports.

Tuition, fees, room and board, books and supplies, transportation, and personal expenses are expected to average \$3,409 for residents and \$2,876 for commuters at public four-year colleges; the figure will be about \$6,082 for residents and \$5,383 for commuters at private four-year colleges for the current school year.

Despite spiraling national inflation, college costs did not increase as much as expected, according to The College Board's analysis. It says colleges worked hard to keep increases in tuition, fees, and room and board minimal this year. Over the last 10 years, college costs have risen about 90 percent.
