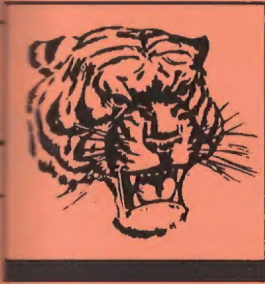

•Sigma Tau Delta

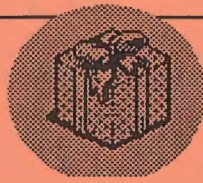
