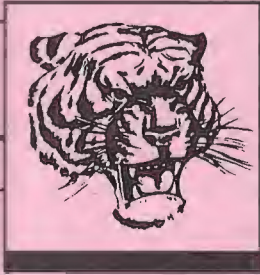

CRIME AWARENESS AND CAMPUS SECURITY REPORT

OUACHITA BAPTIST UNIVERSITY

The following information is being published in compliance with the Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-542). All colleges and universities in the United States who receive any type of federal student aid "must prepare, publish, and distribute through appropriate publications or mails" to all students and employees their campus security policies and campus crime statistics.

Ouachita has operated continuously for 107 years, and it has been committed to having a safe and secure campus since its founding. The "statement of policies" of Ouachita Baptist University is published in the Tiger Handbook for students, and in the University Faculty/Staff Manual for employees. The University provides safety officers that patrol the buildings and properties of the campus from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. daily. The security office is in Evans Student Center, and the officer may be reached by phone by dialing 246-7252. In addition, there are security officers on duty from midnight to 6:00 a.m. in each of the women's residence halls. The campus security officers and the Dean of Students staff work closely with the local Arkadelphia police investigating and solving problems involving criminal activity.

Any student or employee is urged to call the Student Services Office and/or the Security Office or the Arkadelphia police to report any crime or any activity that seems to be criminal in nature. Assistance will be provided by the Student Services staff as well as the security officers in such case.

In-service security training is provided for the housing staff on a regular basis. The campus parking lots and traffic patterns are lighted from dusk till daylight.

Each building on campus has a closing time established by the building manager, and the security officer checks that building on a regular basis to ensure that all doors are properly secured. Provisions for exceptions are made through the activities office of Evans Student Center. Daily reports are made by security and any problems related to lighting, unauthorized visitors, etc. are a part of the written reports.

The university encourages each student to be responsible by taking every safety precaution and to be aware of the safety of fellow students. Every resident student is urged to keep his/her room door locked, to use the engraver in the Student Services office to identify personal items of value. Crime prevention posters, videos, and programs are offered periodically to groups in the residence halls, to special interest groups, and to student organizations. These include personal safety, rape prevention, theft prevention, and other pertinent topics. The University has a professional counselor who is available, free of charge, to assist students with personal problems, crises, and emergencies.

Chita prohibits any involvement with any type of alcohol or other drugs, either on or off campus and is in compliance with The Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989.
