Joint Educational Consortium

The Kodaly String Quartet, a renowned chamber music group from Budapest, Hungary, will appear in concert in the Recital Hall of Mabee Fine Arts Center at 7:30 P.M. on Monday, November 3. The performance, offered free to the public, is sponsored by the Ouachita and Henderson Joint Educational Consortium, in cooperation with the Ross Foundation of Arkadelphia, and Southwestern Bell Telephone Foundation. Formed by four prize-winning graduates of the Franz Listz'Academy of Budapest, the Kodaly Quartet was coached in its early years by world-renowned violinist Josef Szigeti, and Bartok expert Andras Mihlay.

The quartet was first heard in America on the centenary of Kodaly's birth in 1982. Following their highly successful tour in the United States, they received equal acclaim in subsequent visits to many other countries. The members of the Quartet are: Attila Falvay, violin; Tamas Szabo, violin; Gabor Fias, viola; and Janos Devich, cello. The November 3 performance at OBU will include:"String Quartet No. 2 Op. 10" by Kodaly; and "String Quartet No. 1 in c minor, Op. 51, No. 1" by Brahms.
