The Ouachita Singers. . . in existence since 1962, is a select group of 30 singers. With regard for the University's liberal arts philosophy, auditions are open to the entire student body. Under their last two directors, James Luck and Charles W. Wright, the Singers have traveled extensively and have developed a reputation for excellence in sacred literature; a rich, vibrant, choral tone; and the ability to sing a wide variety of literature from classics to contemporary. DeArmond, at the helm the last two years, is continuing and broadening the scope of variety in the literature performed with the Singers and is enlarging their performance scope to include public school and university tours.

David O. DeArmond. . . has recently joined the faculty of Ouachita Baptist University's School of Music. He conducts the Ouachita Singers and Women's Chorus, as well as classroom and studio voice responsibilities. Mr. DeArmond holds graduate degrees in the areas of vocal performance and choral conducting and is presently dissertating at the University of Colorado, Boulder in the history and performance of choral literature. With early music being of special interest, Mr. DeArmond specializes as a soloist as well as conductor in the areas of Cantata and Oratorio literature.

The School of Music. . . at Ouachita has 14 full-time and 7 adjunct music faculty who teach approximately 100 music majors. These students pursue B. M., B. M. E., and B. A. degrees in the areas of Performance, Church Music, Music Education, Theory/Composition, and courses leading to a minor in music. Numerous scholarships are available to academically and musically talented students. The School of Music is fully accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music and North Central.
