Parking at OBU



Parking is a major problem at this time with the construction going on in the area of Walton Gym. This area will serve sixty cars and will be zoned as blue, orange, and silver. When that lot is opened, the entire curb parking from Conger Dormitory around Campus Drive on the east side of Evans Student Center to the Mabee Parking lot will be zoned silver (in other words the orange parking areas will be moved from the east side of Evans to the new parking area.

Also there has been some parking on the street at Mabee Fine Arts center. This illegal parking does not allow for emergency vehicles to get through the campus. Vehicles parked in that illegal zone WILL BE TOWED AWAY AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.

The gravel lot on the south side of Mitchell Hall is open for anyone to park. Commuters, faculty, and those with green stickers may park in the area south of Flenniken. This lot has only been filled to about 30 to 40% capacity since school began.
