




ALCOHOL ABUSE AWARENESS MONTH

Additional information on the following scholarships are available in the Financial Aid Office

- Orvill Redenbacher's is making available twenty-five \$1,000 Second Start Scholarships to the 1995-6 school year. To be eligible, you must be 30 years old or older at the time application and be enrolled part-time or full-time in an accredited college or university Deadline is May 2.
- The John Gyles Education Fund is offering financial assistance of up to \$2,500 to stude in all areas of post-secondary study. A minimum gpa of 2.7 is required. Deadlines are Ap 15, June 15, and November 15.
- The AR Governor's Commission on People with Disabilities is offering \$500 scholarship to outstanding AR students with a disability. Deadline is April 30.
- The American Institute of Certified Public Accountants is presenting scholarships of up \$5,000 to undergraduate and graduate minority accounting students who are US citizens. apply student must have completed 30 hours of college work with at least 6 hours accounting, and have an overall gpa of 3.00.
