A Comparison Of The Ministerial Students and Non-ministerial Students On the Quachita Baptist University Campus

This is a brief study that was conducted during the current semester for the Special Studies section of the Honors Program.

The faculty member who assisted and contributed in this study was Mr. John Halbert of the Sociology Department.

Purpose and Method

The purpose of this endeavor is to determine whether or not significant differences can be found between the backgrounds and opinions of ministerial students and non-ministerial students who attend Ouachita University.

First of all, a survey was devised that would attempt to attain information concerning the backgrounds (family and church) and opinions of the two groups. A copy of the questionnaire used in this survey can be found in Section II of this presentation.

There were 35 ministerial students in the sample, and 121 non-ministerial students. The number of ministerial students on campus is approximately 75.

Findings (From Section III)

Here are a few points of significance that are brought out by the survey: (1) There are no female or black ministerial students within the survey: (2) Thirty-three per cent of the ministers were married while only 14 per cent of the non-ministers were married;

(3) Most ministerial students and non-ministerial students seem

to have spent most of their lives in city churches of towns of

over 10,000 population; (4) When each person was asked about the

approximate income of his parents at the time of his lith hirthday,

the non-ministers seemed to have been from families with incomes

that were larger than the average ministerial student's.

Opinions Concerning Characteristic Traits

The last part of the survey dealt with opinions about traits that have been said to be characteristic of ministers. Each section of this part with be evaluated.

Baptist Pastors

In this section, most of the non-ministers said that ministers were not open-minded, not up-to-date, and emotional. They did, however, agree with the ministerial students in saying that most Baptist Pasters were sincere, adequately trained, hard-working, informed, highly-motivated, satisfied, patient, effective preachers, and evengelistic. Both groups of the sample seemed to be in agreement in ranking their opinions.

All Pasters in General

Here the non-ministers seemed to change their views to a certain degree. They disagreed with the ministerial students by saying that pasters in general are not open-minded, not up-to-date, not boastful, and are satisfied, effective preachers, and

are evangelistic. The ministerial students seemed to feel that most pastors in general were boastful, and did not have effective or evangelistic preaching.

Myself

Here the responses seemed to be about the same. Most ministerial students and non-ministerial students said that they were open-minded, emotional, up-to-date, sincere, adequately educated, not boastful, were hard-working, informed, highly-motivated, and patient.

Perhaps it could be pointed out here that of all the questions on the questionnaire, a large percentage of the sample would complete the section on 'myself" while leaving other sections uncompleted.

Conclusion

This survey could serve to stress the fact that there are no basic differences between ministers and non-ministers. Only in a few restrictive areas do there seem to be a few ethnocentric, biased answers. When this study began, it was expected that harsh differences would be pointed out between the two groups. However, it can now be stated that: according to the evidence submitted within this survey, there are no course or rigid differences between ministerial students and non-ministerial students on the Ouachita Baptist University campus.
