AFRICAN AMERICAN CHRISTIANS WHO MADE A DIFFERENCE

"If you, a family member, or a friend received a blood transfusion to help recover from an accident, illness, or surgery, you can thank Dr. Charles Drew (1904-1950). Dr. Drew was a pioneer in discovering ways to preserve blood plasma. Before his tiem there was no efficient and safe way to store large quantities of blood plasma for use during emergencies. By using refrigeration, Dr. Drew devised methods to safely store blood plasma for lengthy periods of time. As a result of his techniques, thousands of lives were saved during World War II.

"An unfortunate irony cost Dr. Drew his life at age 46. On April 1, 1950, he was injured in an automobile accident. Needing immediate emergency treatment, Dr. Drew was refused admittance to the nearest hospital because of his race. He bled to death on the way to a black hospital."
