FACTS IN BRIEF

College Graduates Do Better in Job Market

Overall, college graduates appear to have a competitive advantage in the labor market. Data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics on adults between 25 and 64 years old offer the following comparisons for 1986:

• Eighty-eight percent of college graduates are currently in the labor market compared to 76 percent of high school graduates. In 1976, the labor force participation rate was 85 percent for college graduates and 71 percent for high school graduates.


• High school graduates are more likely to be unemployed than college graduates. Currently, the unemployment rate is 6.9 percent for high school graduates and 2.3 percent for college graduates.

 Between 1970 and 1986, the unemployment rate for college graduates increased from 1.3 percent to 2.3 percent. High school graduates experienced a significantly greater increase in unemployment rates during this period, from 2.9 percent to 6.9 percent.

 In 1986, 69 percent of college graduates in the labor market held positions in managerial and professional fields. In comparison, only 13 percent of high school graduates were employed in such occupations.


Unemployment Rates by Level of Education, 1970 and 1986
