From the President:

I thought you would like to hear that student financial aid fared very well during the 97th Congress, according to Dallas Martin, executive director of the National Association of Student Financial Administrators. In fact, he writes in the latest NASFA newsletter, the funding "exceeded the budget requests that had been made by the administration." Among the "good news" items revealed by Martin:

GSL	\$3.0 billion	\$2.5 billion	\$3.1 billion (up!)

The point is that the student aid picture for 1983-84 looks brighter than many had feared it would. This is not a bonanza, by any stretch of the imagination, but enough to be optimistic about.

As far as O.B.U. is concerned, our funds were not decreased this year and could actually receive an increase next year. Please help us spread the good news.
