ARKADELPHIA, Ark.—Ouachita Baptist University's Department of Music will present two chamber ensemble concerts Nov. 1 and Nov. 2 in McBeth Recital Hall. The Wednesday, Nov. 1, concert will be held at 8 p.m. and showcase the brass instruments, and the Thursday, Nov. 2, concert will be held at 7:30 p.m. and will showcase the woodwinds. The concerts are free and open to the public.

"These concerts are unique because you will hear a variety of ensembles and music," said Dr. Heather Thayer, assistant professor of music at Ouachita. "There are several different instruments performing many different styles of music."

The brass concert will include "Achieved Is the Glorious Work" from *The Creation* by Franz Joseph Haydn, "Ave Verum Corpus" by William Byrd, "Power" by John Stevens, "Ave Maria" by Franz Biebl, "Hogwarts Forever" by John Williams, "Scarborough Fair Revisited" by Fred W. Teuber, Edward Gogolak's arrangement of "Personet Hodie," "Farandole" from *L'Arlesienne Suite No. 2* by Georges Bizet and "Old Man March" by Robert Nagel.

The woodwinds concert will include "Danza Ritual del Fuego" by Manuel de Falla, "Quintet Op. 124" by Giulio Briccialdi, "Andante" and "Allegro Marziale" from "Annen-Polka op. 137" by Johann Strauss, "String Quintet in G minor K 516" by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, "Quatour pour Flutes" by Pierra Max Dubois and "A Gaelic Offering" by Catherine McMichael.
