ARKADELPHIA, Ark. – Ouachita Baptist University's Division of Music will host Dylan Blackwood in his sophomore recital on Friday, March 16, at 11 a.m. The recital, which is free and open to the public, will be held in McBeth Recital Hall in Ouachita's Mabee Fine Arts Center.

Blackwood, a musical theatre major from Walnut Ridge, Ark., will perform Marvin Hamlisch's "I Can Do That" from *A Chorus Line*, Richard Rodgers' "All Er Nuthin" from *Oklahoma* and Chris Miller's "Time" from *Tuck Everlasting*. He also will include a dramatic presentation of Scene 15 of Andrew Bovell's *When the Rain Stops Falling*.
