

OT salvation and Israel's rejection of Jesus




Old Testament Salvation

The nation of Israel was granted access into God's family based on their faith in God and obedience to God

NOT based on their nationality or ethnicity

Evidence:

- 1 Cor 10:1-13 & Heb 4:6
- Some Israelites were cut off from God's family because of disobedience
- Some Gentiles were accepted into God's family in the OT
 - Rahab
 - Ruth



Israel's Rejection of Jesus

The reason that national Israel was "cut off" was because they rejected Jesus Christ

Rom 9:2-5, Rom 9:18-21, Heb 10:28-29



From national Israel to the whole world




God's Purpose for Selecting Israel

Beginning with Abraham, God chose Israel to be a vessel to reach all nations for his glory



Israel failed by continuously disobeying God in the OT, then they also rejected Christ





Now to the Gentiles

Romans 11

After Jesus's death on the cross, God opened his arms to the Gentiles: a complete reversal!







Romans II:1-6

I ask, then, has God rejected his people? Absolutely not! For I too am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, from the tribe of Benjamin. 2 God has not rejected his people whom he foreknew. Or don't you know what the Scripture says in the passage about Elijah—how he pleads with God against Israel? 3 Lord, they have killed your prophets and torn down your altars. I am the only one left, and they are trying to take my life! 4 But what was God's answer to him? I have left seven thousand for myself who have not bowed down to Baal. 5 In the same way, then, there is also at the present time a remnant chosen by grace. 6 Now if by grace, then it is not by works; otherwise grace ceases to be grace.

God's People in the New Creation


Revelation 21:3
