A 1985 ARTIST WINNER OF NFMCC

Native of Johnstown, Pennsylvania, Donna Zapola is the 1985 Young Artist Winner in the Woman Solo Voice/Opera Auditions. She is the 1985 National Winner at the Metropolitan Opera Auditions, first place winner for General Voice in the 1985 Liederkranz Vocal Auditions, 1984 finalist in the International Opera Singers Competition sponsored by The Contemporary Opera, Inc., and has been awarded the Minna Kaufman Rund Scholarship.

Miss Zapola's training includes graduate studies at Carnegie-Mellon University, Pittsburgh, PA, 1982-84; undergraduate studies (B.M., Voice, 1980) at Seton Hill College, Greensburg, PA.

During the summer of 1985, she served as an Apprentice Artist at the Chautauqua Opera where she has previously been a Studio Artist as well as a winner of the Chautauqua Music School Piano Concerto Competition.

Currently Miss Zapola resides in New York City and is a student of Marlena Kleinman Malas.
