ARKADELPHIA, Ark.—Ouachita Baptist University's Division of Music will present its Jazz Band in concert on Monday, Nov. 5, at 7:30 p.m. in Jones Performing Arts Center on Ouachita's campus. The concert will be open to the public, and admission is free.
