ARKADELPHIA, Ark. — The Division of Music in Ouachita Baptist University's School of Fine Arts will present Cordell Hufstedler in his junior vocal recital on Friday, March 3, at 11 a.m. in McBeth Recital Hall. The recital is free and open to the public.

Hufstedler is a junior vocal performance major from Thayer, Mo. His principal applied instructor is Dr. Margaret Garrett, professor of music at Ouachita.

During his recital, Hufstedler will perform "Per la gloria d'adorarvi" from *Griselda* by Giovanni Bononcini; "An Chloe" by W.A. Mozart; "Du bist wie eine Blume" by Robert Schumann; "Quanto è bella" from *L'elisir d'amore* by Gaetano Donizetti; "Nuit d'etoiles" by Claude Debussy; "Le Dromadaire," "La Sauterelle" and "Le Dauphin" from *Le Bestiaire* by Francis Poulenc; "As it is, plenty" from *On This Island* by Benjamin Britten; and "Oh, Wasn't Dat a Wide Ribber," arranged by H.T. Burleigh.

Hufstedler will also perform two of his original compositions: "Amber," for which he wrote the lyrics and music, and "my skin whispers," with lyrics by Emma K. Smith and music by Hufstedler.

Smith is a junior theatre arts and Christian studies double major from North Little Rock, Ark.

"When I perform such a diverse set of songs, I realize the many hearts and minds that have touched the music I sing today," Hufstedler said. "As a composer, I am honored to continue that tradition."
