We, the Big Fork United Baptist
Association met with Antioco. Church Scott County Ark. State of Arkansas. Saturday the 5th day of Oct A. D. 1889. Pursuant to adjournment. The Introductiony sermon was preached by Eld. A. A. Bates, from the 9th Chapter of Proverbs and the 1-2-3 verces. At 11, o'clock A. M. And J. G. Hardin, concluded; after a short Intermission, for Refreshment, the Association was called to order by the Moderator, and prayer by Brother R. Suit. Dear, Brethren and Sisters, in the Lord; We again witness the loveing kindness of the Lord, in permitting us once more to meet in council, and we humbly trust that what ever may have been our failings, our great aim has been to promote the Glory of God, our saviour, and the interest happiness and peace of his Church, and people Our desire to be thankful for the love and condesendsion which has prevaled since we last met, for his mercies which have secured to us the privelege of meeting once more, this side of a vast and Boundless Eternity. And to stir up your pure minds by way of circular letter, and to warn you of evil, and error, and to exhort you to obedience truth, and faitofulness. There are many societies, in this day, which are called the Church, and, many other institutions, which are called Religious, we will call your attention to the Church of God, and inquire what it is, the Church of God, where is she? and by whom sit up? she was constituted and sit up by Jesus Christ. The word church, is believed to mean a body, or congregation, called out of, Brought into, an united up principles of fellowship in the gospel, so as to make our compact Body the Kingdom of Heaven, our Church of God, was constituted and set up in the world by Jesus. Preaching the Gospel of the Kingdom, and to make ready a People Prepared for the Lord, John bore testimony to the Savieur and taught Repartance, and faith, in him that the people should bring forth fruit most for Repentance, and be Baptimed with water unto Repentance. his Baptime was from Heaven, and did testify the sufferings, Death, Burial, Hesurecoton and Association of Cirist, to Glory. This Jesus proved when he come to John to be Baptimed, and mild suffer it to be so now for thus it beforeach us to fulfill all Right-counsess. Hence we see the Scripture prove that Church and Kingdom of God was set up in joint empact by Jesus Christ. In his sermon delivered on the mount to his Discipies. one of you, in the name of Jesus. Chrest, for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. Then they that gladly received his word were Baptized.

And the same day there were added to them, three thousand souls. And they continued Steadfast in the Apossats Doctrine and in Fellowspip and in breaking bread and in prayers These with other Scriptues Prove that Church and Kingdom; were set up by our Lord, Jesus Christ. And that the spbjects were stelleemed, from all Iniquity. Born of the Spirit, Baptized, 1st to testify the sufferings, Deuth, Burial, and Resurection of Christ, and 2d. in the figure that they are dead to sin, and alive unto God, by the spirit, being planted to gather in the likeness of his Death, and showing also the Resurrection of the body after Death. And 3d, the answer of a good Conclence towards Gol by the Resurection of Jesus Christ from the dead. Being confirmed by the apostles as a Church. At pentecest from this Church Jerusalem, the gospel of the Kin; i) not Heaven went forth, and will be fully Preached by the apostals and other ministers who are called or God, and qualified by the libely Gost, and preach the word, and testify of Jesus, they are set a aprt by the Church and ordained by a presbytery of faith and order and in Fellowship with thi Church at Jerusalem and each other so they were the United Body. And this is the reason why We are called the mystic buly of Christ, Helng connected togather by joints and Bands and knit togather in love that there should be no schism although perilous things should come and some Depart from the faith, giving heed to sedpoing spirits and Doctring of Devils and the man of sin be Revealed and seen sitting in the temple of God, whose comeings is after the workings of Satan with all power, and signs, and lying wanders,

and with all conceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish. The scriptures assures us that God, will preserve and bear up his Church, and Kingdom, in the world, as first set up by Christ, and confirmed by his apostals, through grace given for this perpose. Although, the Church, should go in to the wilderness for a time, times and a half time, in consequence of persecution, and many saints be put to death for the testimony for Jesus. Yet, she will come out of the wilderness, leaning on the arm of her beloved. Read, and compare, the Scripturs with Church History, by Jones. Benedict, and Robinson. the proof is clear, that this period is past, and that the Church, is now in her United, Compact. call the Kingdom militent. She is now opposed by gog, and company, and the anti-christian, powers, Rever' Ch 13. The two Beasts, the first of whech rose up out of the sea, and the Dragon gave unto his power, and seal, then the Beast Reigned, and not the Dragon. Then the second Beast Reigned. (Rev XVI 12 etc.) and the sixth angel poured out his vial, and John, saw three uncleen spirits, like frogs come out of the mouth of the dragon, and of the mouth of the beast, and out of false prophets, they are the spirits of devils. working mericles which go forth into the Kings of the earth and of the whole world to guther them to the battle of that greag day of God almighty. And he gathers them to gather, in the place called in the Hebrew, tongue armagedon, which is the mountain of the Gospel. What we have written, we believe is sufficient to satisfy any canded mind in surch of truth, that now is the time of gog and his army, horses, and horsemen, clothed with all kinds of armor. Now Bretherin, we commend you to God, and the word of his grace, preying that the grace of our Lord Jesus, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Chost rest

and abide all you all. Amen. .

Article 1. This union of churches, shall be known, and distinguished by the name, and title of Big Fork united

Baptist, Association.

Art 2. This association, shall be composed of delegates from churches, in union. Each church shall be entitled to their delegates, who shall be Requested to furnish satisfactory evidence of their appointments, by their church before takeing their seats.

Art. 3. The Delegates when convened, shall organize themselves in to a Deliberate body, by the appointment of a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be chosen by ballot, at each annual Association, and continue in Office, until their successors are chosen.

Art. 4. This association, shall not interfere with the right of the churches of which it is composed. It shall regard them as independent bodies, in all matters of internr! Government: and shall only act as an advising council assuming no authority, except, what is expressly delegated to it by the churches, or evidently, implied by the very nature of compact. It nevertheless, Claims authority over its own members, and herdelegates from the churches and in justice, and propriety, must have power to withdraw from, and disown, all churches which depart from the principles of this compact, by tectoring retudic in faith, or disorderly in practic, it should therefore regard all courches united with this constitution, with a vigilant eye for good. Its principle business shall be to Fromto the declarative glory of Gcd, by extending the kingdom of grace, one earth, through the medium of presching the gaped and the means in accordance with the graph, to cultivate union, and Fellowship with all the churches of Christ. Especially with those united under this constitution.

Art. S. Newly constituted thurches, or churcher dismissed from other Acrociations of the same faith and order, may be admitted into this union, on their reading up those deegates to the annual meeting of this Association, with a partition for admission, and by

their Delegates agreeing to the abstract of principles here with Published.

Art. 6. The churches in this Union, shall transmit to every Annual Session of the association, a willien communication specifying the name of their delegates, their number in fe lik wide, number Paptired. Received or Excommunited, Restored or dismissed, since the last review. And all other internation which the church may deem imperiant, which aball be read and minuted accordingly.

Art. 7 This association shall have a fund, supplied by contribution of the churches, and all money, thus contributed, shall be transmitted from the Churches, and paid over through the committee of finance to the treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot, and hold his office during the pleasure of the association, and manage the funds agreeably. He shall return to the order of the association, and present annually, for insersion in the minutes, a clear, and sufficient statement, of all the receipts, and expendituses.

Art. 8. This association, shall furnish the churches,

with the minutes of every session.

Art. 9. This association, shall take cognizance, of no query sent up from the churches, unless, they have endevored to solve the same, and have failed; nor of any difficulty, between churches, unless they have pursued the dictations, of the 18th, Chapter of Mathew, and have not been able to settle them. Then, this association shall take such matter, into consideration, and act upon them at its discretion-

Art. 10. It shall be the duty of the Clerk, of this Association, to keep a regular file, of the printed minutes of this body, and deliver over the same to his successor in Office-

Art. 11. This Constitution, may be altered, or Amended, at regular meetings of the associations, by the concurring voice of two thirds of the mambers then present. Provided such alterations, or aminimized, be approved by the Churches, of the Association.

Art. 12- There is to be no Sunday collections: taken up in this Association, nor men appointed to preach, what is called missionary sermons, but to chuse their own subject.

—RULES OF DECORUM.—

1 .The Association, shall be opened, and closed, by prayer.

3 A moderator, and Clerk, shall be chosen by the sufferage of the members present.

3 The moderator shall be considered a Judge of order, and shall have a right to call to order at any time.

4 A member not satesfied with this decision. may appeal to the Association, on the same day, but not thereafter.

8 But one member shell speak at a time, who shall rise to their feet, address the moderator, obtain permission, and then proceed to speak.

6 The moderator, when addressed by a member for permission to speak, shall signify the same by nameing the person or otherwise.

7 No member shall be interupted while speaking unless, he departs from the subject, or is guilty of personal reflection. Every motion made and seconded, shall come under the consideration of the association unless withdrown by him that made it.

- " 8 Every case taken up by this association, shall be decided or withdrawn, before another is approved.
- 9 When any question is taken up, after allowing time for debate, the moderator, shall tkae the voice of the association, on the subject, and the members on the affirmative shall signify the same by riseing from their seats. and those in negative, all when the question is put to them, rise from their seats.
- 10 Any member wishing to retire; shall obtain permission, from the moderator.
- + 11. No member shall speak, more than twice, on the same subject, without permission of the association. Nor more than once, till every member wishing to speak shall have spoken, nor shall any proposition be made to close the subject, till the debate is carried through.

12. The application of brothers shall be used in the association, by members in their address to each other.

- 13. The names of the members, shall be called as often as the association, shall direct-
- 14. No member, shall be tolerated, in any practis, which tends to interupt public speaking.
- 15 The moderator, shall be entitled to the same priving of speech, as any other member, provided, he appoint another, to fill his reat during that time, but shall not be allowed to vote, on any question, unless the Aracciatics, be equally devided, then, he may give the desiding vote.

16. Any member violateing these rules, may be reproved by the moderator, at his discretion, but only on the day the breach shall be done.

⟨ ARTICLES OF CHRISTIAN FAITH. ⟩

Art. I We believe in only one true, and living God. And that there is a trinity of persons in the God head, the Father, the Son, and Holy Ghost, and that it ere three are one Art. 2. We believe the scripture of the Old, and Now Testimenta, are the word of God, and the only rule of faith and practis.

Art s. We believe in the fall of Adam, and that the deprivity of his fallen nature, was entailed upon his posterity, and in the importancy of man to recover himself by his own irre will and ability.

Art 4. We believe in Election through manctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth.

Art 5. We believe in the final Resurrection of the Saints, and that they will never finally fall away and be lost.

Art 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God, and by the righteousness of Christ, imputed to them; and that it pleased God, by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believed.

Art 7. We believe that good works are the fruits of faith, and follows after justification, and are evidence of

our own Gracious state.

Art. 8 We believe, there will be a resurrection of the dead; and a general Judgement, and that the happyness of the righteous, and the punishment of the wicked, will be never ending.

Art 9 We believe, the visible Church of Christ, is a congregation of faithful persons, baptized, who have gained christian Fellowship, with each other, and give unto the Lord, and one another, and have agreed to keep up a Godly, disciplin agreeabl to the rules of the Gospel.

Art 10. We believe, that Jesus Christ, is the great Head of the church, and the only law-giver, and the disciplin is with the body, and should be faithfully kept up for the glory of God, and the prosperity of his people,

Art. 11. We believe, that Baptism by immersion is the apostolic mode, and true believers the only fit subjects

Art. 12- We believe, THAT THE LODES, SUPPER, are ordinance, of the Church, and SHOULD BE CONTINUED, till Christs, second comeing.
