Hopkins and W. L. White appointed to read the letters from the churches. The Moderator appointed the pastor and deacons of Palestine church with Bro. Wortman a committee on divine service. Committee on divine service reported preaching at night at Estes' school house by G. W. Evans and P. E. Windham, at Palestine church by R. P. Claborn and L. B. Blackman, at Fellowship church by L. F. Patterson and D. C. Yeargin. Election of officers resulted as follows: R. P. Claborn, moderator; J. M. Ledbetter, clerk; B. D. Barnes, treasurer: Roll called and corrected. Received petitionary letters as follows: Lynch Prairie church, Scott county, Sugar Creek church, Logan county. Appointed committee on finance as follows: W. A. Vinyard, G. C. Anthony and P. E. Windam. Correspondence called for. J. W. Miller from Short Mountain association, W. D. Maffit and B. S. Council from Dardanelle association. All visiting brethren were seated. Those seated were D. C. Yeargin, H. L. Bean, G. W. Allen, J. J. Hartsfield, L. W. Dearing and W. H. Ezell. By motion Sabbath collection to be applied to home mission work. By motion mass meeting Sabbath evening at 5 o'clock p. m. in the interest of a religious paper being gotten up by H. H. Millburn in Indian Territory. Adjourned until Monday morning, 8 o'clock, a. m. Benediction by J. N. Penington.

Windham, G. W. Evans, B. D. Barnes; nominations, J. N. Penington, B. D. Barnes, M. Q. Wortman; foreign missions, L. F. Patterson, P. E. Windham, James Edmondson; domissions, H. J. Roberts, I. J. Lucas, G. W. Evans. At 2 o'clock met mass meeting, listened to an eloquent address by L. F. Patterson in behalf II. Milburn's paper to be published in the Territory. Also an able Benediction by D. Adjourned one hour for refreshments, after which the moderator called the body together Prayer by G. W. Evans Motion that Concord church be granted a letter of dismission from us. Carried. [Appendix G.] Treasurer's report received and adopted. [Appendiv H.] Elder R. P. Clayborn made his report as missionary. Report received and adopted. [Appendix I.] Report on Foreign missions received and adopted. [Appendix J.] Motion carried that we pay our clerk, J. M. Ledbe.ter, ten dollars for his service in getting out our minutes. The association voted thanks to Palestine church and community for the very generous and hospitable entertainment during the session. Unity and love prevailed during the entire session. 
Missionary's Report.
